# Three incumbents re-capture position on elementary Board of Education

Voting in the Clark Board of Education Elections on Tuesday followed much the same trend as last year, with the three incumbents who supported the budget winning their seats on the elementary School Board and the elementary School Budget going down in defeat.

Re-elected were incumbents John A. Frazzetta, Mrs. Marie Seva and Michael J. Dudek. They received the most votes: 1,445, 1,412 and 1,412, respectively.

Barbara A. Pisano, who came in fourth, she was followed by Mrs. Anna W. Altman with 1,245 and Kenneth W. Davis with 1,245.

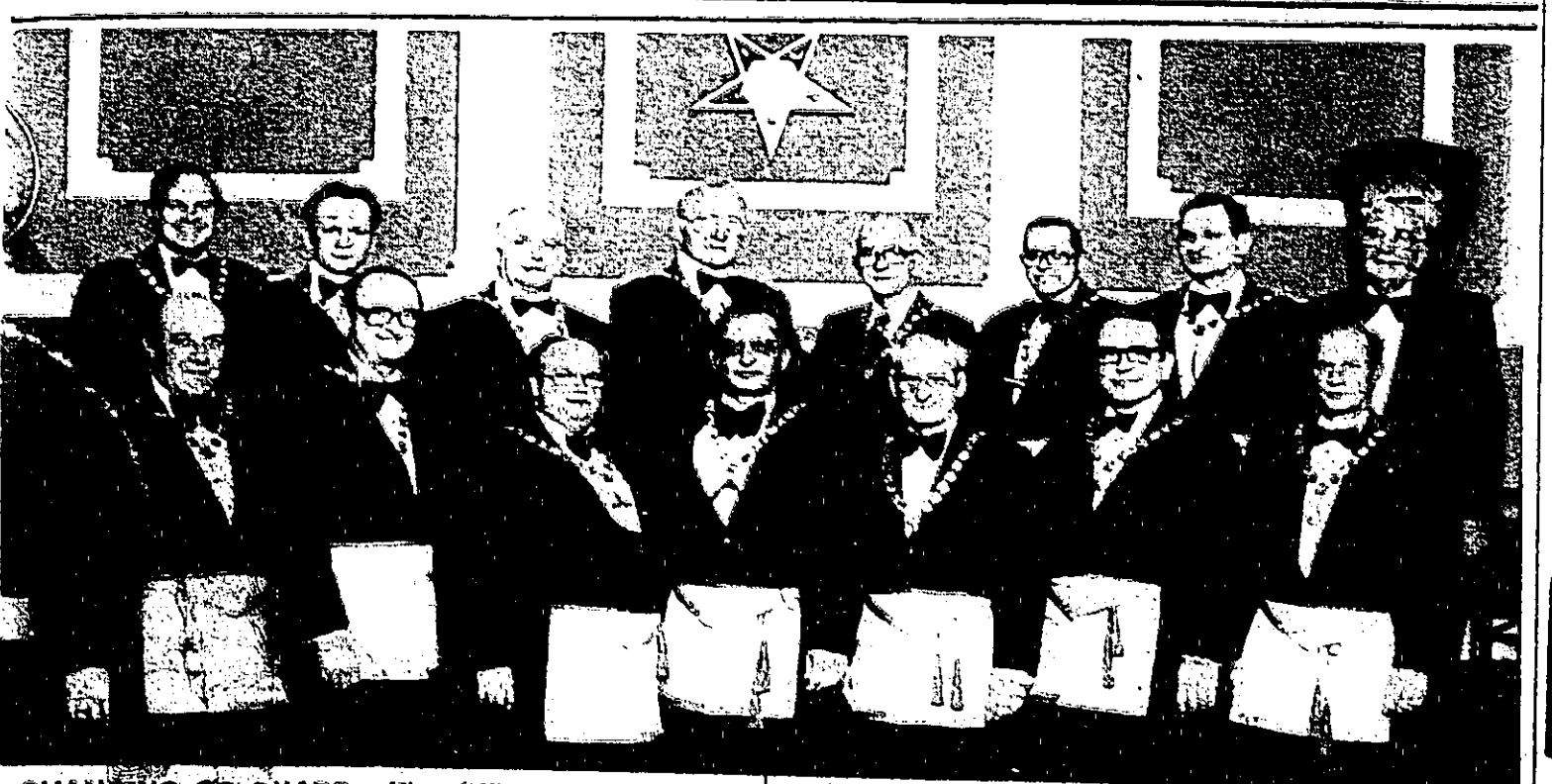
