The council members said they had been misled by a group of people who had been circulating a petition asking for the elimination of the budget. The council members said they had not seen the petition until after the vote had been taken.

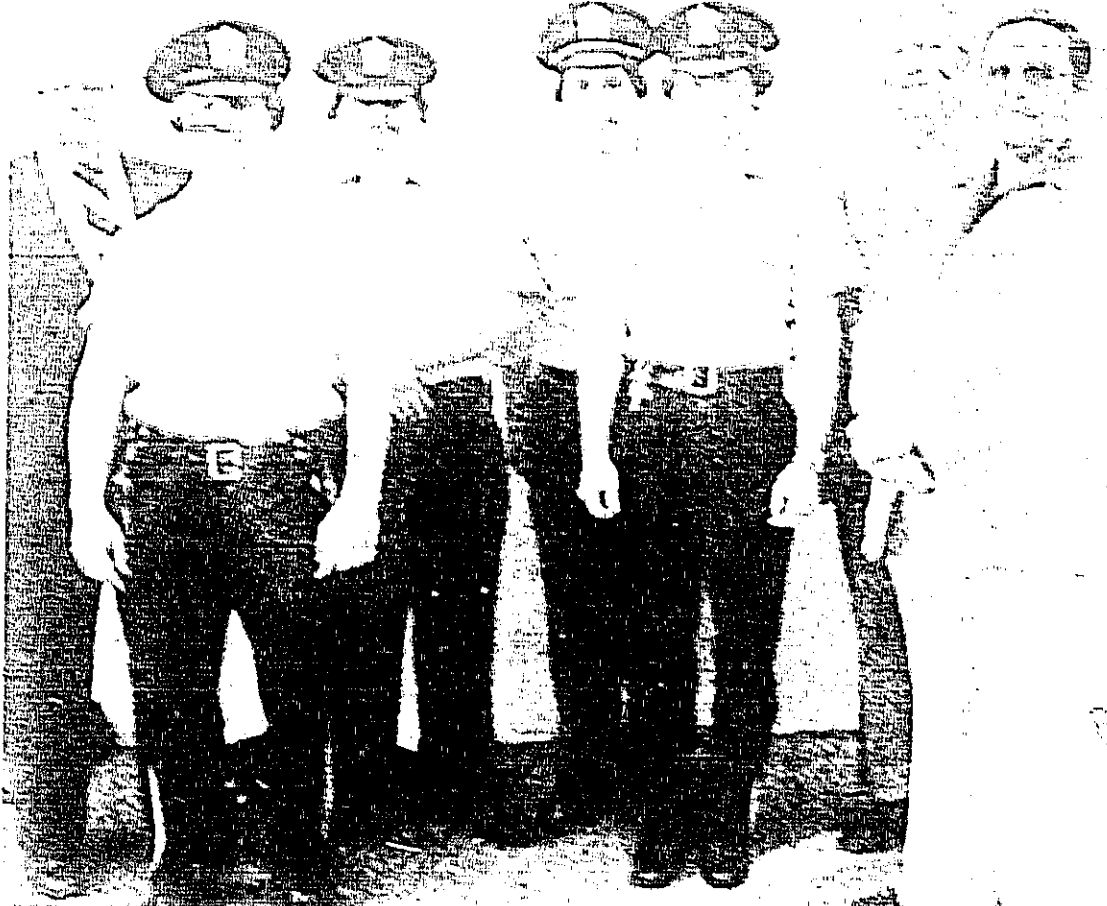

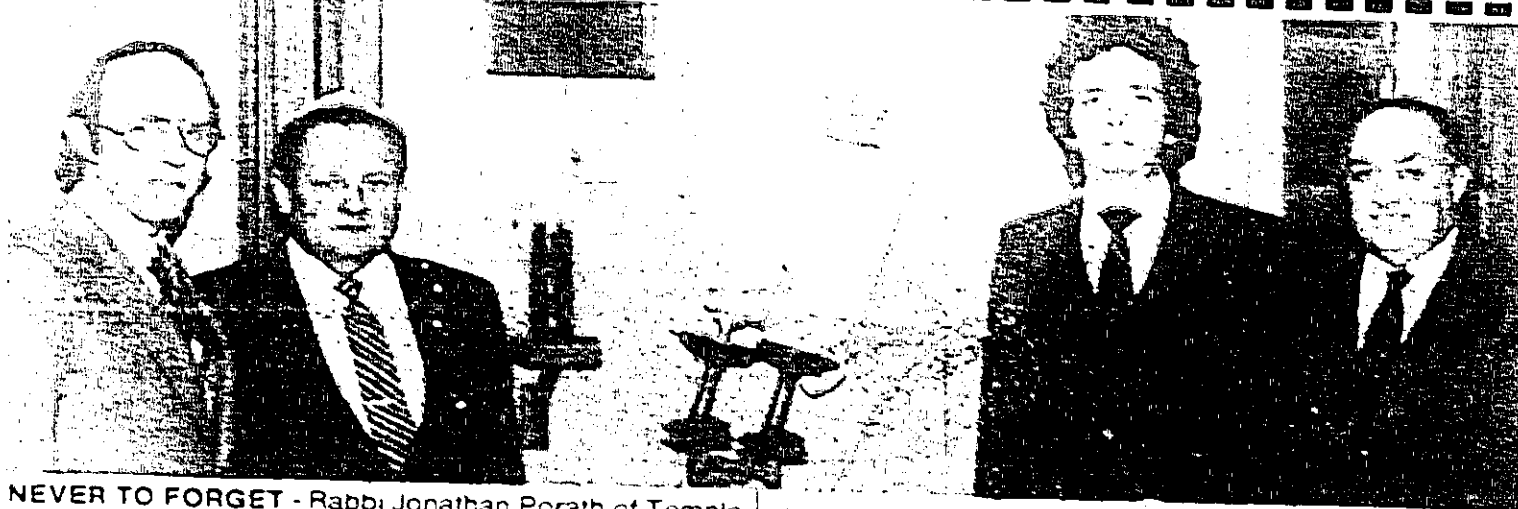
