Several were present from this city, including Messrs. Harry Hall, C. H. Miller, Wm. McCloskey, C. D. Marsh, Geo. Morin, Wm. E. Chamberlin, all honorary members of the Zouaves, and Messrs. W. C. B. Reeder, D. G. Urmon, J. C. Bore, R. Avery, P. Muir and J. D. Truhal, active members. There were 140 surviving members of the brigade present.

Under the head of "More Good Men Frightened," the Elizabeth Leader publishes the following: "Several prominent men of Middletown, N. J., are considerably excited by the centennial of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. One of them, a Mr. Wilson-Fry-Moore, and a syndicate have been formed to engage counsel to defend her before the court. Like her case, our citizens who were active in Jennie's case, then very good men of Middletown, are considerably excited by the situation they are in, with confessions what she knows. If Jennie makes up her mind to reveal the history of her operations in this case and elsewhere, a number of cases for divorce will undoubtedly be on the court calendar for the January term.
