THE CENTENNIAL PROGRAMME. At the recent session of the New Jersey Historical Society, the following programme was suggested for the passage of the Presidential party through New Jersey on the way to New York City to celebrate the centennial anniversary of Washington's inauguration as President of the United States, on April 27th next.

The President and his party to be met on the arrival in Newark by the Legislature, State officers, Judges of the Supreme Court of Errors and Appeals, Justices of the Supreme Court, Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor, and by representatives of the N. J. Society of the Cincinnati, the N. J. Historical Society, the Washington Association of New Jersey, the Grand Lodge of Free Masons, and other representatives of the State.

The Governor signed the sunset law repealer on Monday, and the Republican caucus to obstruct the voting of working men is thus wiped from the statute book.

From Elizabeth the President and his party, delegations from representatives bodies, and leading citizens generally, will proceed in carriages to the New Jersey State House, where they will be met by the Legislature.

It is suggested that military salutes be given at Trenton, Princeton, Monmouth, Camden, New Brunswick, Rahway, Elizabeth and Elizabethtown, on the arrival of the Presidential party at those points.

It is also recommended that the Governor be requested to address a public message to the Legislature at this session, on the subject of the celebration, and recommending a special appropriation of from one to three thousand dollars to defray the expenses incident thereto.

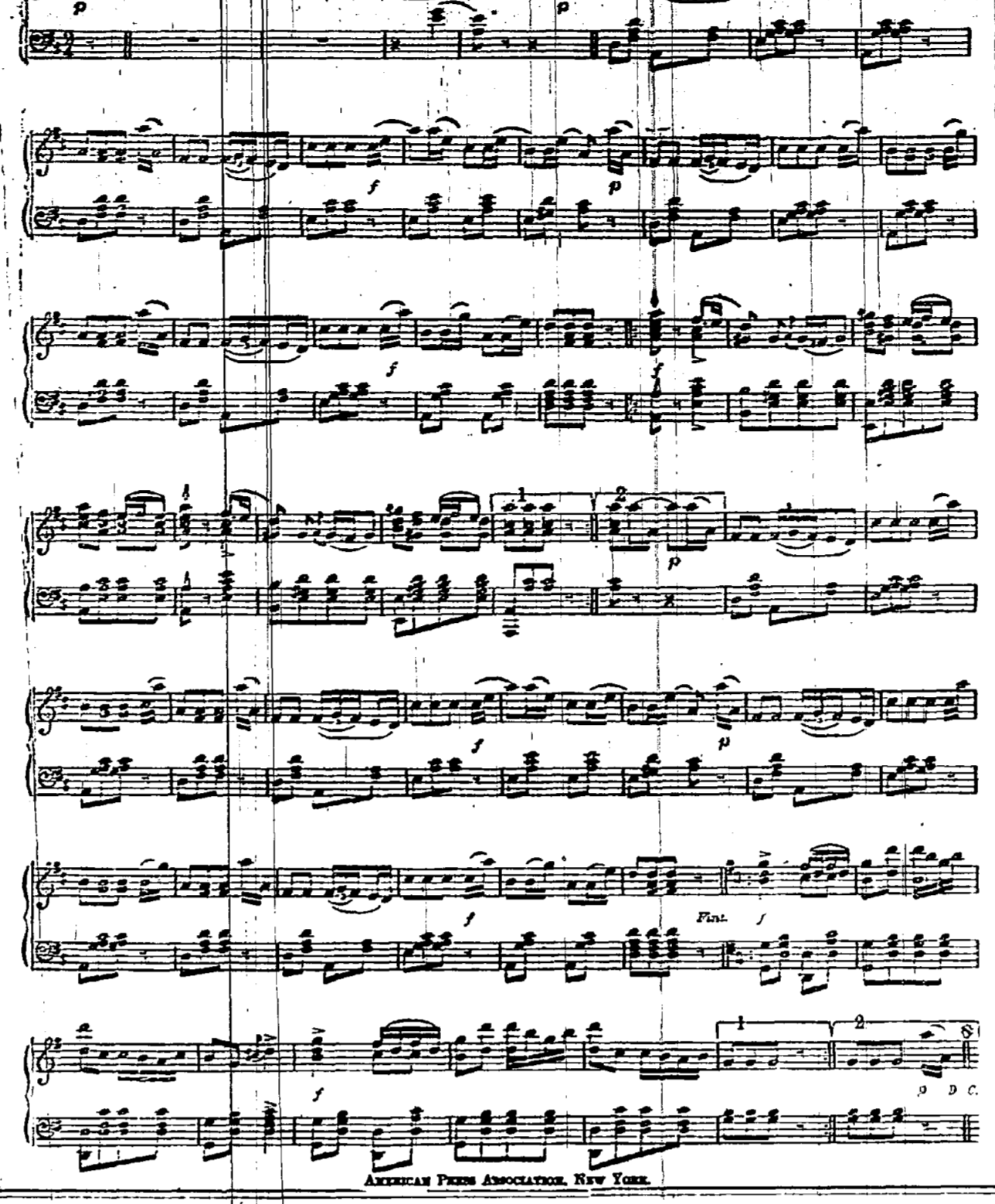
