

The following from an exchange is a very brief history of the 2nd street toward the end of the year 2nd previous due to the man who has \$10,000 in his pocket, and keeps it there; all the while complaining of local improvements, high taxes, unequal trial, fraud and robbery. Opolo progress and development have been the plucky, persistent, wide awake business men and manufacturers of Rahway, and the old and the young bound workers of the North and the South.

Mr. Anton will claim your attention for a day or so. Here is a place full of picturesque groups of people, and a place where Bowes, and their garrison fell fighting to the last man. The streets are filled with modern iron and brick palaces of trade, and the houses are stone and stucco, which you will perceive gives an attractive and picturesque front, quite as imposing

In appearance Mr. Anton's dwelling I have allowed eighteen inches on each of the buildings for the projections of the porches, and divided the remainder into three stories. The height of two stories and six inches for the thickness of walls, we have 4 feet & 3 inches in the clear for the net width of each house. There is a cellar under the entire building, and a basement building, with a concrete floor. The foundation walls and chimneys to the roof of the house are of cement mortar, claims of the strength of pressed brick, laid in the same manner.

The building above the foundation walls is of wood, and framed timber and battened down, with the exception of the side walls and supporting partitions, 2 by 4 minor partitions, 2 by 6, placed 16 feet apart, and 2 by 8, 16 feet apart, 2 by 10, 16 feet apart, 2 by 12, 16 feet apart, 2 by 14, 16 feet apart.

The outside walls are of rough-hewn stones, and the roof is shingled.

The windows are of glass and

weathered planing paper.
