Now that General Sherman has gone, the Philadelphians want to know where we shall have another man in this country who does not want to be President!

We published in our issue, Feb. 1, Lane, Assemblyman from the 8th district of his county, for copies of a number of important bills before the Legislature. Mr. Lane has proven to be one of the most active and diligent members this year.

THE LEGISLATURE.

The present Legislature, with a Democratic majority in both Houses, dispatches business more rapidly than with any other memory.
