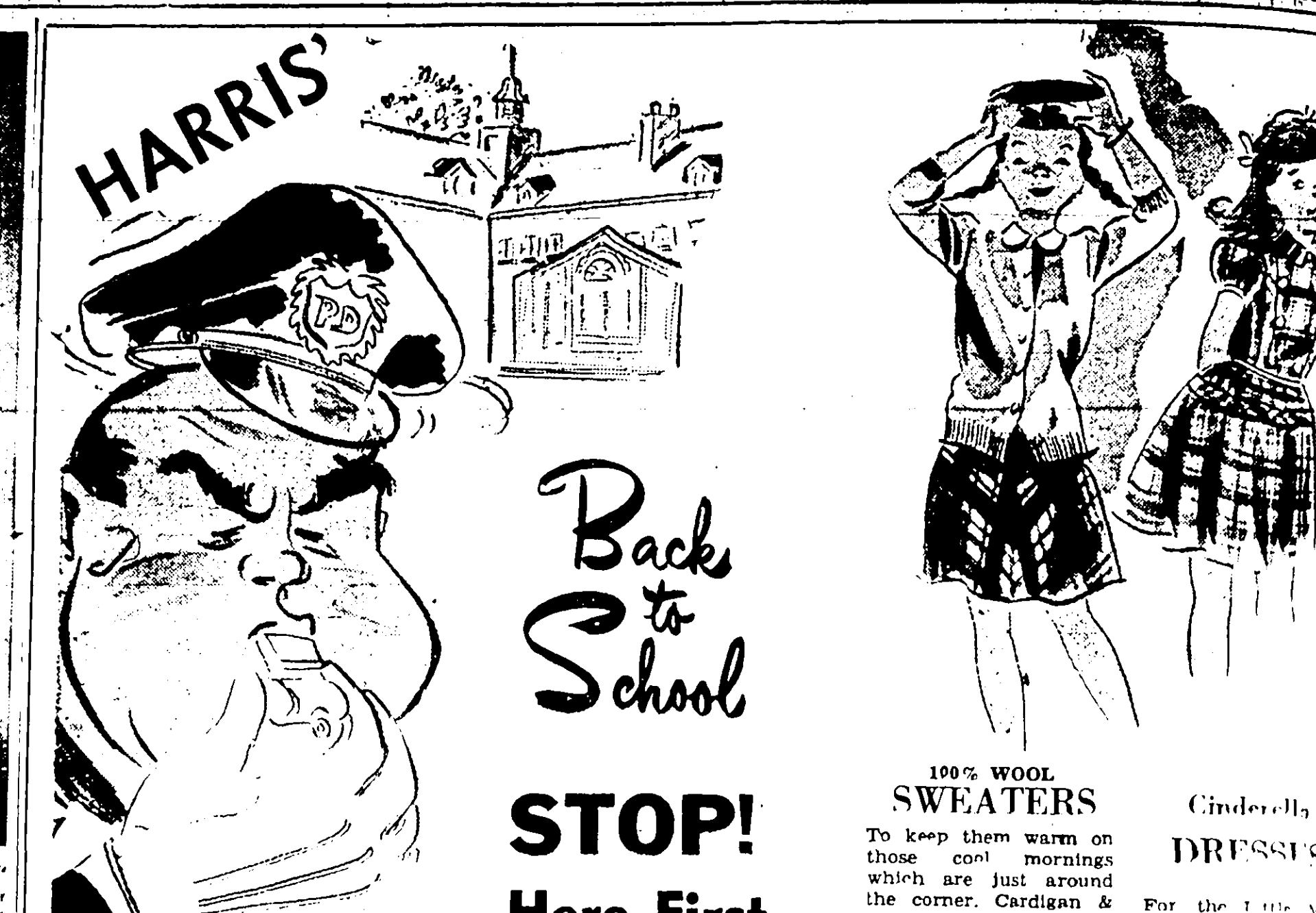

How soon do you think the veteran can expect to get his settlement for the amount due him after he has made in his claim?
There will be approximately 15 million of these claims. To be processed, the services will have to be made as rapidly as possible. However, as the result of de-mobilization, they are being made with great delay. The length of time required to settle these claims will depend largely on how careful the applications are filled out and how much administrative work is required on each application.

All veterans are advised that they should not present any claim to the finance office to which the claim is mailed without first obtaining a receipt of the application. The finance office will not return the discharge certificate. The services have requested that letters of inquiry be kept at a minimum. The number of personnel available for processing these claims is limited. If they are called to answer numerous letters of inquiry the time spent on actually processing the claims will be reduced. After the veteran has made his claim he should write to the finance office only in the case of a change of address. Aside from that, he should just sit tight and wait.

The Counselor's Office of the Veterans Service Committee, Room 202, City Hall, Rahway, will have a supply of the application forms and will assist in preparing them. Arrangements have also been made for notary services. While awaiting receipt of these forms at the Post Office, this office will advise all veterans to obtain photostatic copies of their discharges. Since you have until September 1, 1947, to file this claim, the statute date of this claim, and other service organizations if you spread out the period of application over the next two or three months.

4. The elector must not be under any legal disability.

5. The elector must not be a convict of a crime involving moral turpitude, unless he has been pardoned or his civil rights have been restored.

6. The elector must not be a pauper, unless he has been discharged from the status of pauper.

7. The elector must not be a person who has been adjudged insane, unless he has been discharged from the status of insane.

8. The elector must not be a person who has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, unless he has been pardoned or his civil rights have been restored.
