

\$19,710 Grant For Training Awarded Clinic

A grant of \$19,710 to train two resident psychiatrists in child psychiatry has been awarded to the Union County Psychiatric Clinic, 111 E. Front St., by the United States Public Health Service.

Benjamin H. Haddock, the clinic's Executive Director, announced receipt of the award today. He said the Department of Health, Education and Welfare had indicated the grant would be renewed for an additional four years. The total grant is based upon \$5,250 toward research costs, and \$15,000 in stipends to the residents.

Haddock said that the grant is dependent upon obtaining qualified residents. They must be psychiatrists with at least two years in psychiatric training.

The clinic services are located in Union County and North Plainfield. Its major service is treatment of emotionally disturbed children. It maintains offices in Plainfield, Elizabeth, Summit and Linden.

Furniture Cleaning Gets Easier

The dream of simply using a hose to wash down all the household furnishings has yet to come true but daily and weekly upkeep is getting easier.

Continued research has resulted in many improvements in finishes and cleaning equipment. For example, plastic finishes that resist surface soil have been incorporated into, or applied onto, hard and soft goods.

With these improvements, dust and soil may settle, but do not cling or become imbedded in the surface of fibers. In many instances stains can be sponged away without leaving a mark.

Floors and floor coverings are easier to maintain. Resilient floor coverings are frequently coated with special finishes at the factory. The treated coverings are tough, durable, and resistant to scuffing and wear.

Some wood flooring is prefinished to seal the pores. An occasional light waxing and buffing is all that is necessary.

Many cabinets and moldings are factory finished with a protective seal or coating. In the kitchen the rim of great will accumulate on top of the finish but will be absorbed into the grain of the wood. The grease can readily be removed with a liquid household cleaner.

"Carpeting of natural or man-made fibers is easy to maintain. Once a week vacuuming and light daily cleaning will keep carpeting in good condition.

Upholstery fabrics are treated with soil resistant finishes. Vinyl fabrics can be cleaned with soap and water or a specially formulated cleaner.

Leather upholstery should be treated regularly with leather soap to keep it flexible. Many tables, chests, and other pieces of wooden furniture have special finishes or treatments to prevent scratching.

Although home care is easier, there is still the daily, weekly and monthly cleaning to be done.

A positive attitude toward cleaning and good use of cleaning equipment will help to get the job done better and faster.

The award was presented on behalf of the Raritan Valley Chapter by its Director of Educational Activities, Morris B. Kadlin, C.P.A.

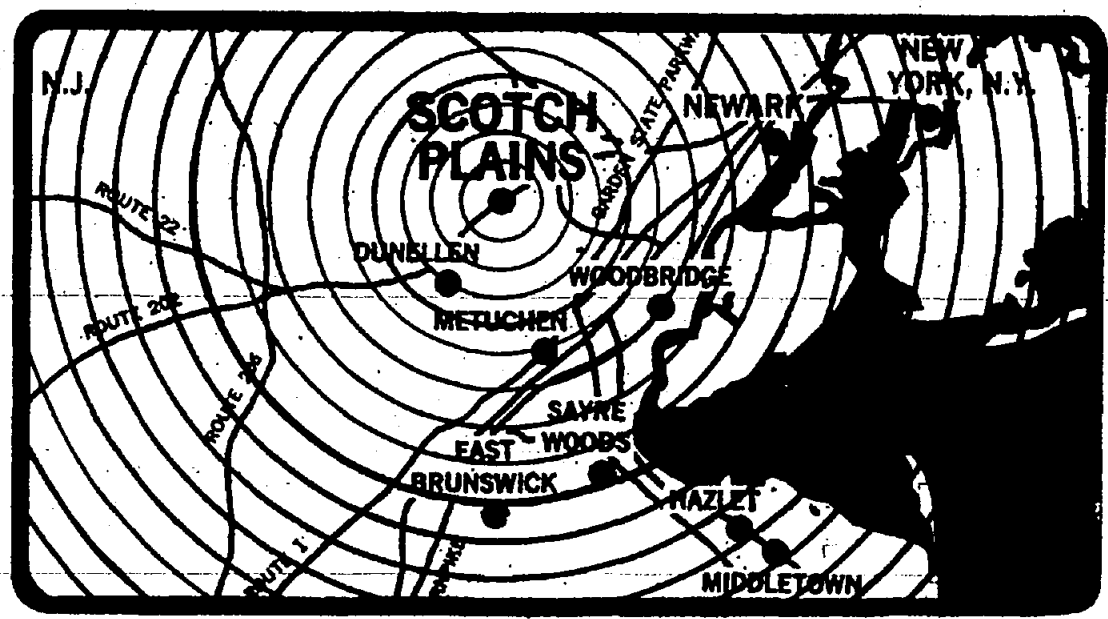
