

# Kiehn Advocates Tax Relief For Parents With Children Attending Private Schools

A resolution to ask Congress to provide tax relief for parents of children attending private schools was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Rep. James C. Kiehn, D-N.J., on Feb. 10.

The resolution, H.R. 10000, would allow parents of children attending private schools to deduct the cost of tuition, books, and other expenses from their federal income taxes.

Kiehn said the proposal would help parents of children attending private schools, many of whom are in the middle class, to afford the cost of education.

The resolution would apply to children of all ages attending private schools, including day camps and day schools.

Kiehn said the proposal would be a significant step toward making private education more affordable for middle-class families.

## Police Chief Recommends Assignment Of Four Men to City's Traffic Division As Step to Lowering Accident Rate

Police Chief Herbert I. Kinch of Rahway, in his annual report to Mayor Daniel L. Martin and the municipal council, recommended that four men be assigned to the police department's traffic division "on a permanent basis" to increase enforcement of traffic laws.

Kinch said the recommendation was based on an analysis of the causes of 381 reportable accidents which occurred last year in Rahway.

The major cause of 230 of these accidents, or 60 per cent, was speed, followed by improper lane change, failure to yield at intersections, following too closely and red light violations by the motorists.

## School Board, Education Association, Deadlocked on Salary Negotiations, Are Reported to Be \$300,000 Apart

The Rahway Board of Education and the Rahway Education Association have reached an impasse in salary negotiations for the 1971-72 agreement, Louis E. Boch, board president, announced at Tuesday night's meeting in Roosevelt School.

Boch stated that a mediator will be asked to confer with the board and the REA under the provisions of the state's Public Employees Relations Commission regulations. The president said that the board and the REA are "approximately \$300,000 apart" in their proposals for a salary agreement.

The board voted, 6-2, to table a motion to accept emergency school assistance amounting to \$84,318 from the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare. The fund would be used to improve relationships between the community's residents. Richard M. Nash, superintendent of schools, reported that he would like more time to study the proposal for institution of the program.
