Delay in Primary Election Now Seems Less Likely

Chances that the primary election would be changed from June to September were reduced last week when Superior Court Judge Samuel Allcorn Jr. in Newark denied a request for in injunction barring implementation of the new State Senate and Assembly districts. The districts were approved last month by a bipartisan commission. The request for an injunction was filed by the American Civil Liberties Union which maintained the redistricting plan nonth by a bipartisan commission.

Is unconstitutional, Judge Allcorn declared there is "an obvious necessity of government progressing" and that he could see no reaso why the new redistricting plan should not be used at this time The judge added that once the suit is argued he or another court may rule that the planis unconstitutional but in the mean-time the secretary of state may proceed with preparations for the scheduled June primary.


