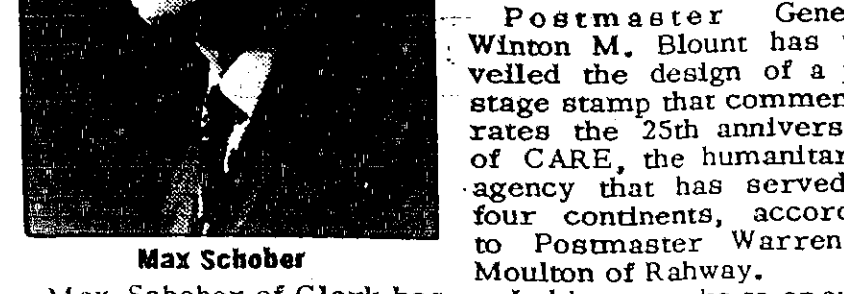

US Stamp For CARE Scheduled

Postmaster General Wilton M. Blount has announced the design of a postage stamp that commemorates the 25th anniversary of CARE, the humanitarian agency that has served on four continents, according to Postmaster Warren T. Moulton of Rahway.

In his remarks to an audience of CARE supporters at the Mayflower Hotel, Washington, Mr. Blount noted the far-reaching scope of the American-Canadian organization, which has been on the scene providing assistance to victims of earthquakes, floods, famine and war since the Berlin blockade. CARE packages were flown into that isolated city, he said.

CARE, an acronym for Cooperative for American Relief Everywhere, was founded in 1946. The first stamp will be issued on Oct. 27, 20 years after the organization was founded in New York City. It was designed by the artist of New Rochelle, N.Y.

At the top of the vertical stamp, set in a blue globe, is the CARE logo, a stylized figure of a person. Below the logo, the words "CARE" and "COOPERATIVE FOR AMERICAN RELIEF EVERYWHERE" are printed.

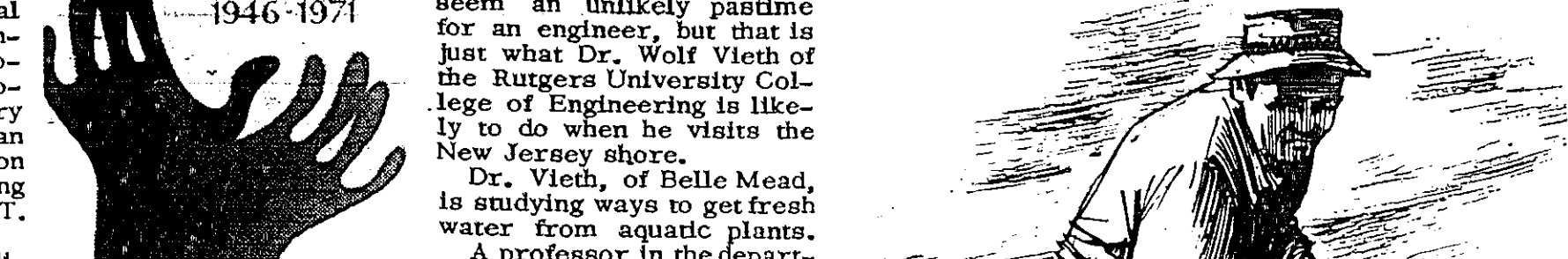

Way to Obtain Fresh Water From Seaweed Studied



1946-1971

Collecting seaweed may seem an unlikely pastime for an engineer, but that is just what Dr. Viet V. of the Rutgers University College of Engineering is likely to do when he visits the New Jersey shore.

Dr. Viet, of Belle Mead, is studying ways to get fresh water from seaweed. A professor in the department of chemical and biological engineering, he hopes to expand his studies into a research project to determine the practicality of recovering fresh water from New Jersey's salt marshes.

Seaweed, Dr. Viet explains, is a type of plant called lamina. It digests, has been found to be capable of removing salt from water, and it has its own life processes. It does, however, concentrate a relatively large amount of potassium in the water it takes in.

In order to be potable, the water must be separated from the seaweed. Dr. Viet proposes to do this by using a process of evaporation. The seaweed is placed in a container, and the water is evaporated, leaving the salt behind.

The plant, could then be used, he says, as a potential food source or a source of potassium. A telephone survey, headed by Dr. Viet, is currently being conducted to determine the feasibility of this process.

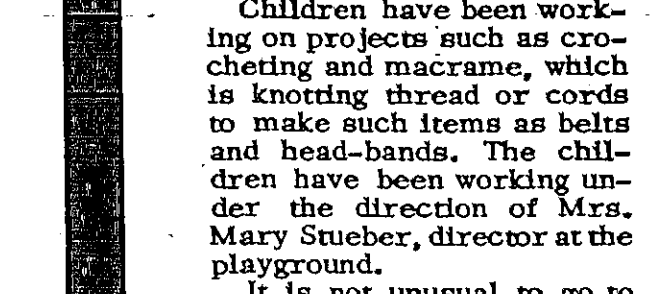

County, School Costs Must Be Cui To Preserve Homeowner Finances

The New Jersey State Chamber of Commerce has done a great service by studying the 1971 impact of the local property tax which is used to finance municipal government, county government and local public schools.

As the public would expect, local real property taxes are expected to rise in 1971. The average increase is \$255.5 million, and the total take of the real property tax is \$22.2 billion.

This outstanding increase comes on top of a 15.1% increase in 1970 over 1969, that 15.1% is \$257.8 million.

The study by the chamber shows three highly noteworthy developments:

- The total annual tax levy exceeds \$2 billion for the first time.
- School taxes lead the way with the largest dollar jump ever.
- The per capita property tax statewide is set at \$80.

Throughout the state the real culprits who have pushed upward to unprecedented levels are many freholder boards and the hundreds of local boards of education. Almost three-fifths of all the money raised by the local property tax is spent on local education, and that amounts to \$1,288,150,017 in 1971, an unprecedented jump of 15.7%.

The state's freholders spent \$435,224,510, an increase of 1.6%, and they spend \$465,740,283 of the total \$2.2 billion.

While not every local board of education or county freholder board is responsible for this inequitable and irresponsible increase, there are, no doubt, plenty of parties who are the makers of this monstrous jump.

New Jersey is a state of homeowners who cannot bear taxation on this order. We should also remind our readers that any state politician who even breathes a word about another state broad-based tax, the much-debated state income tax, easing local real property taxes should be promptly defeated.

Former Gov. Richard Hughes said that time across the country, for the sales tax, alone, he was promised—rather prediction about events over which he had no control—was totally inaccurate. The real property taxes are increasing by more than ever.

In fact, Gov. Hughes spread that line in the absence of any statistical evidence. He was not even accurate for accuracy, that one of our friends refers to his sales pitch as "the line that spread from High Point to Cape May."

An article on the front page of this issue based on statistics reviewed by the State Chamber of Commerce deals with all of the real property tax increases for 1971. They speak for themselves, and readers are urged to read the article and to let it offer them "relief" through the passage of another tax.

At this time in New Jersey, the only good tax is one that is not implemented. Boards of education and freholder boards should be urged to hold the line on spending. The only alternative is endless unfair taxation that will make homeowners the prerogative of the rich.

School Board Is Wise to Set Policy

One of the controversies in schools and colleges today concerns the unauthorized distribution of publications by students and other persons on properties of the educational institutions.

The publications, which in most cases were the work of the students, often contained material that was derogatory in character or in poor taste.

The Rahway Board of Education has wisely established a policy which establishes guidelines for distribution of newspapers, pamphlets and other printed material which may be distributed on school property.

The policy makes it clear that material which comes under the classifications of "hate literature" or "hate propaganda" is prohibited. It also bans advertising materials, appeals for money, campaign literature and publications which would disrupt classroom procedures.

Places where approved literature may be distributed on school property and the times when such distribution may be made are stipulated by the guidelines. Persons responsible for production of the literature must be identified. The policy makes it clear that approval must be obtained from the school principal and that an appeal from this or her ruling may be made to the superintendent of schools and board.

The policy also states that students found guilty of violating the rules will be dealt with under the discipline procedure. Non-students will be prosecuted as trespassers.

We are happy to note that the guidelines also require those who have been given permission to distribute material to pick up any such material discarded on the school grounds.

With such guidelines, as with the discipline code, there should be no doubt as to what is permitted and what is not permitted. If any question does arise, the board must decide whether the material should or should not be permitted to circulate on school grounds. The board has the right to deny the material to the public to see that the schools are operated without disruption and in the best interests of all.

The policy on distribution of printed material on school grounds is a step in the right direction.

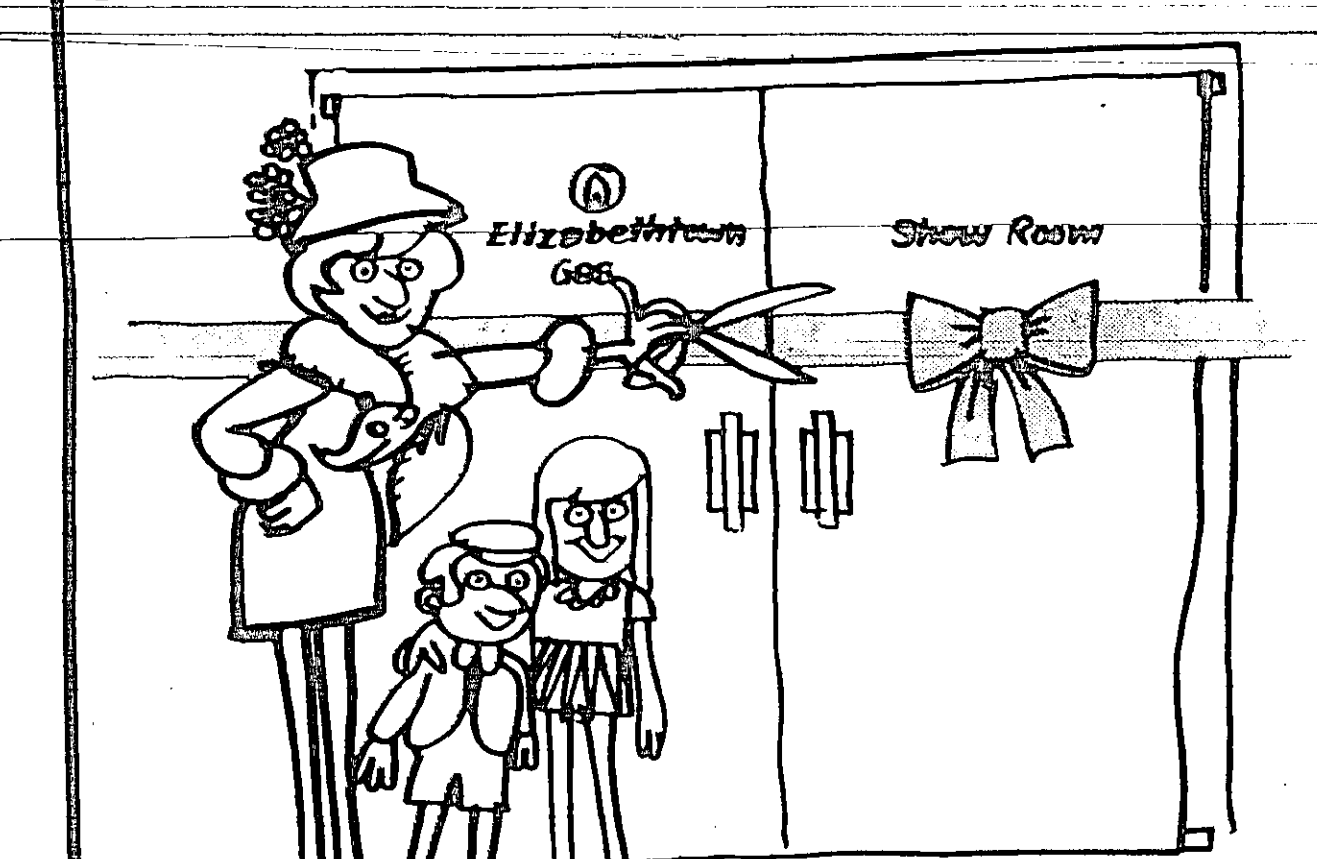

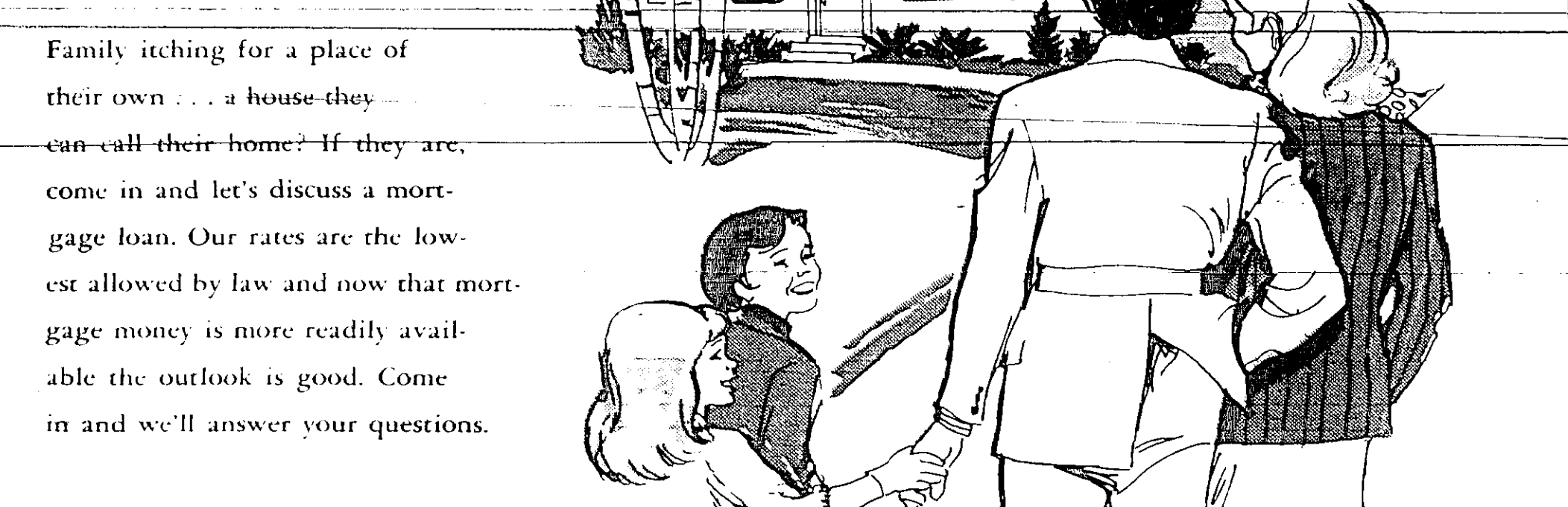
