## Rizzo Stays To Decision By NJ Dept.

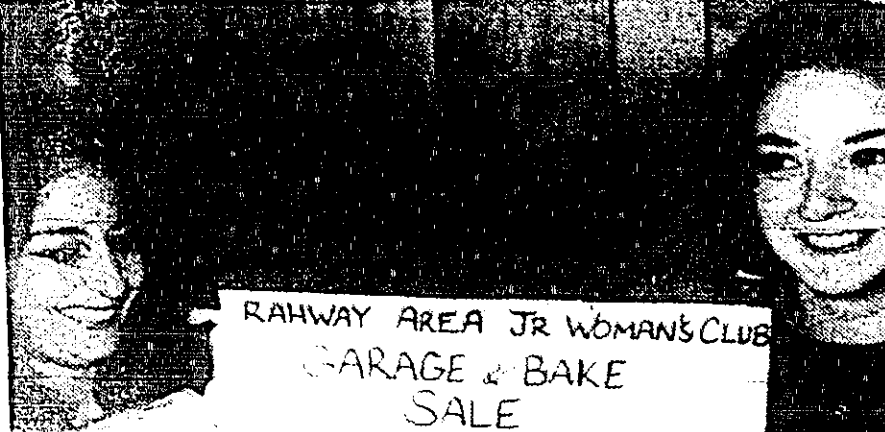
According to a letter issued to the Rahway Board of Education by its attorney Leo Kahn, Louis R. Rizzo will continue to be a member of the board and his name will be continued on the board's minutes. This appointment to the board is being challenged by four members of the body, Dr. John J. Sprawls, Joseph L. Keefe, Eric H. Huchins, and Harry W. McKeown, with a petition before the Office of Controversies and Disputes of the State Department of Education.

At the May 15 meeting, Mr. McDowell and the Sprawls left the meeting as that a quorum was not present. Mr. Rizzo was subsequently elected 4-1.

Mr. Rizzo contended that the two members left the meeting because they did not like his 4-1 decision by staying.

Three members are expected to conduct board business, and Mr. Kahn ruled that any action taken without the members present was illegal.

Mr. Kahn has threatened the board that if it did not back his 4-1 decision, he would file a petition with the board of education and Mr. Rizzo as defendant.

## Summer School to Open On June 22 for 5 Weeks

A Rahway Secondary Summer School program, sponsored by the Board of Education, will be held from June 22 to July 28 for students in grades 7 through 12. The purposes of the program, under the direction of Herman Kagan, vice principal, include enabling students to earn a passing grade in subjects previously studied, providing an opportunity to raise a low grade, or to improve mastery in a subject.

Among the subjects offered are English (7th through 12th grades), all languages, basic mathematics, algebra I and II, geometry, biology, chemistry, physics, social studies, history, II, bookkeeping I, II and III, stenography I and II, business law, business machines, typewriting I and II, and personal use typing.

Tuition for each subject is \$2. Registration will be accepted Monday through June 20 at the high school office. A registration fee will be charged without full payment.

The summer school rules of conduct will be explained to all pupils on the first day of school, at which time all students will report to the school for class and teacher assignment. Regular attendance is imperative and tardiness will be penalized. The school will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

## School Calendar For Next Year Is Approved 5 to 4

What student calendar should be used next year? This question was the subject of a special meeting of the Rahway Board of Education held in Roosevelt School.

Members of factions on the board lined up behind the calendar each favored. Supporting the calendar that was finally adopted after nearly 45 minutes of debate were Edward J. Higgins, James L. Keefe, Louis G. Rodwell, Paul Lukowski, and Louis R. Rizzo, who was appointed to the board at its stormy May 15 meeting.

Calendar No. 1, the winner, provides for four three-day vacations and a spring recess. The calendar that was rejected would have no holidays in October but would provide a mid-winter recess from Feb. 10-15.

Classes will be held Monday through Friday, with school days listed and start times from 8 to 9:30 a.m. and the second period from 9:30 to 11:05 a.m. Additional subjects may be offered upon request, if sufficient students enroll. The school reserves the right to withdraw courses for which registration is insufficient.

## Residents Protest Cut in Service On Bus Route 132

Residents along Princeton Street, Inman Avenue and the area between the two streets are unhappy over the proposed cut in service on bus route 132. The plan to reduce the number of buses traveling the route from 12 to 8 has been in effect for several months of no service at all.

The once-a-day bus has been cut to twice a week. Prior to the strike, buses went from the Rahway Business Center to Inman Avenue and then into Columbia. Since the strike, service terminates at the intersection of the two streets, with the exception of the one bus taking the Princeton Street route which began service one day ago.

Route 132 was the subject of a similar tussle with residents last August when service was reduced from 13 to seven runs daily.

The company is claiming the line loses money, and says it will subsidize its claim before members of the Public Utilities Commission.

Residents say the line is patronized, and that without service many people will be forced to walk long distances. Duke Road residents, for instance, are more than two miles from an alternate bus route.

The service that began Tuesday is supposed to have 12 buses leaving the Firehouse at 7:30 a.m. and another coming from Newark to leave Broad and Jersey at 7:30 p.m. The route will be in operation "Monday" through Friday, it was stated.

## Judge Upholds One-Year Moratorium On Construction of Service Stations

The Rahway Municipal Council's ordinance banning construction of gasoline service stations in the city for one year was upheld on May 23 by Superior Court Judge Milton A. Feller in Elizabeth.

Judge Feller ruled against the Mobil Oil Corporation of New York which sought to obtain a variance for a gasoline station at St. George Avenue and Murray Street.

Seymour S. Lichtenstein, an Elizabeth attorney who represented Mobil, argued that the ordinance adopted by the city was unconstitutional.

"A municipality may adopt a stopgap ordinance which, if not temporary, might be considered unconstitutional," Judge Feller said. He added that a municipality must be careful to exercise its power with great caution.

Judge Feller pointed out that in the present case there is a terminal point of one year. "He called such a restriction 'reasonable'."

The Rahway Board of Adjustment rejected Mobil's application for a variance on Oct. 18, 1971, on the ground that the station would be within 200 feet of a playground.

The judge noted that the playground cited is more than 200 feet from the property proposed for the station. The city claimed that the proposed station site will be dedicated for playground use.

Judge Feller commented that there is a question whether the land has been set aside for playground use. He returned the case to the Board of Adjustment for further clarification of the playground boundaries.

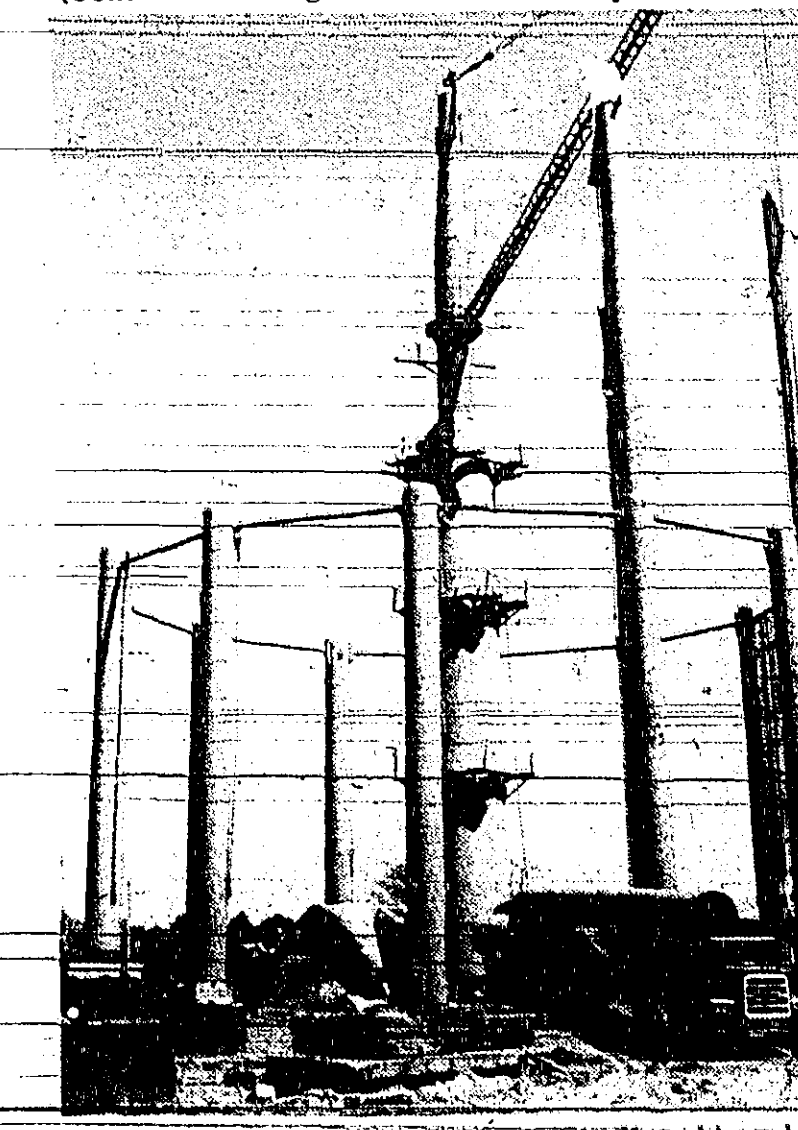
## GOP Club Plans To Hear County, City Candidates

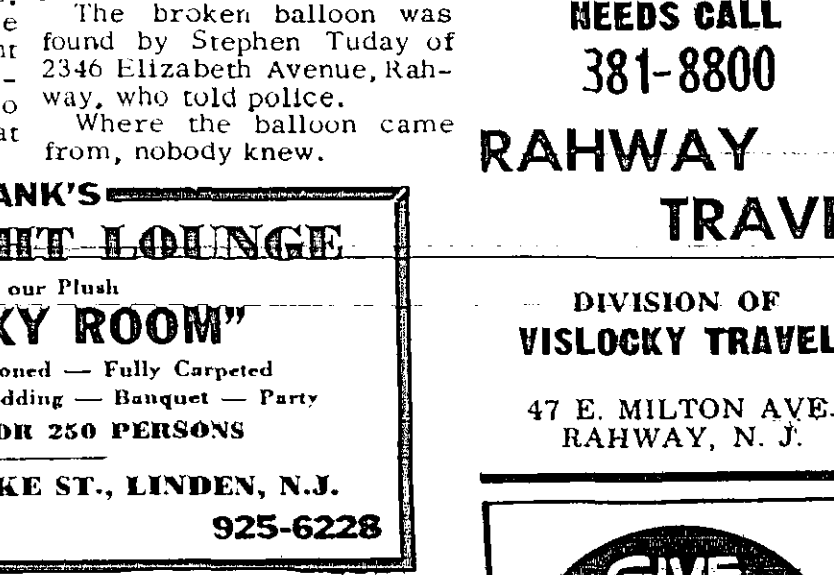

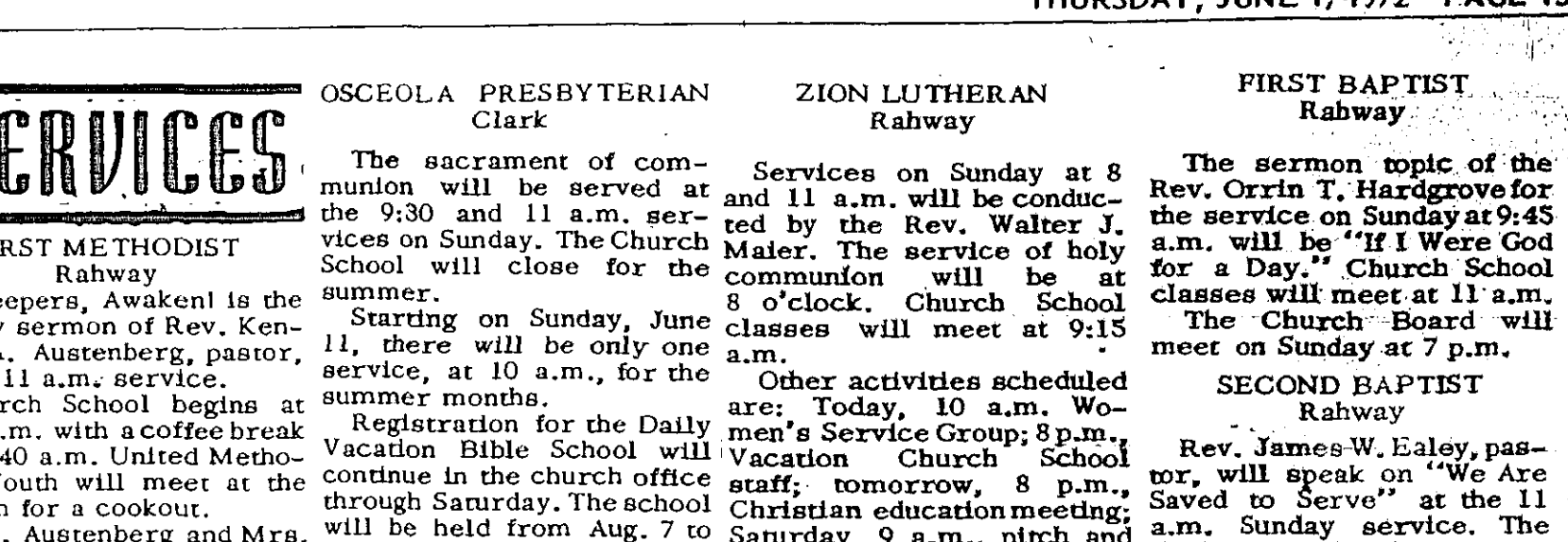
