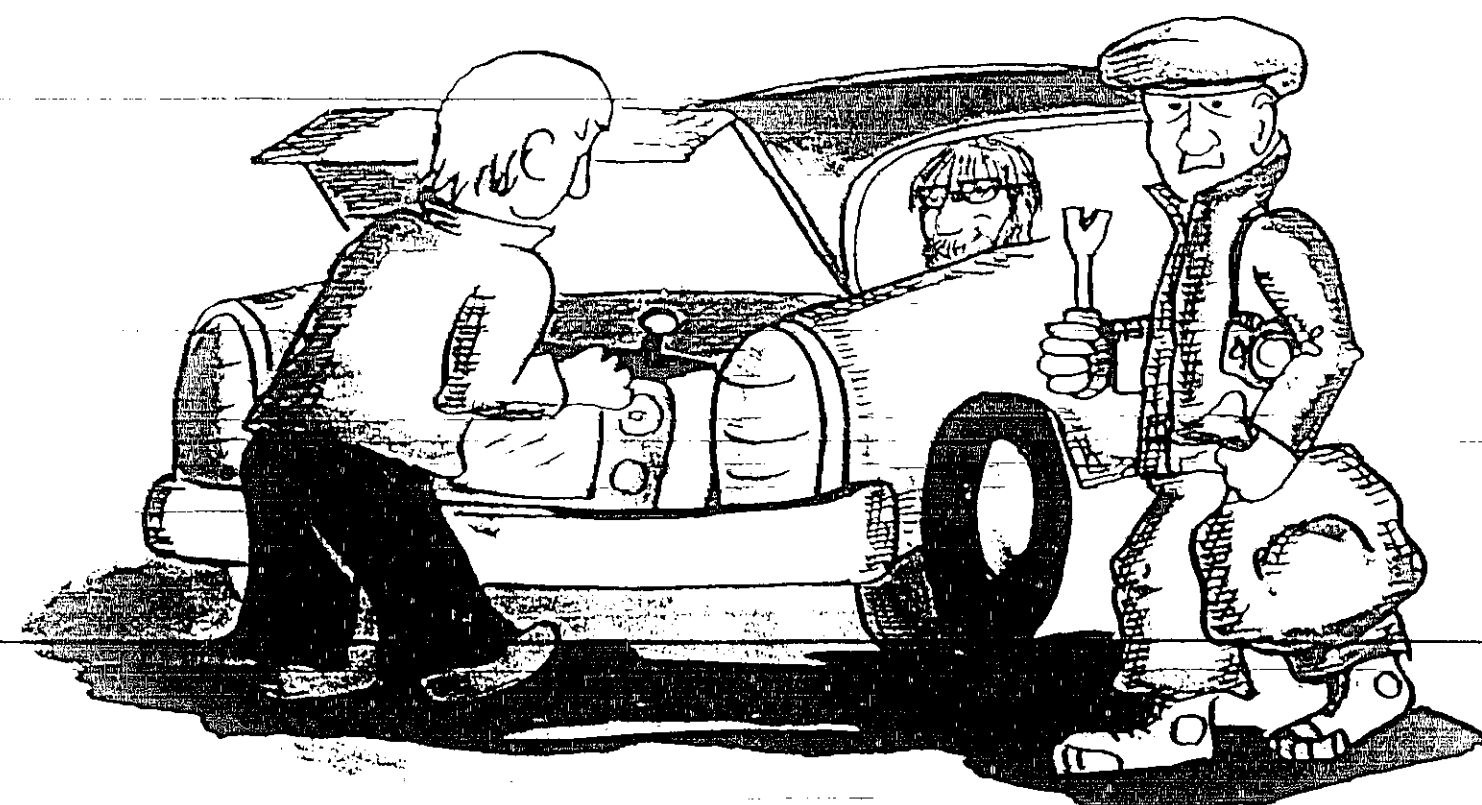

Kinneally Indicted by County For Bribery and Extortion

James J. Kinneally Sr., of Rahway, former chairman of the Union County Democratic Committee, and two other residents were indicted last week by a Union County Grand Jury on charges arising from the application by William F. Heller for a variance to construct an eight-story hotel and an eight-story office building in Clark.

The Clark residents indicted by the jury were Louis W. Heller, former chairman of the township's Board of Adjustment, and Thomas Partillo, who is a former Clark Democratic chairman. Mr. Kinneally, who was indicted earlier this year as a result of a grand jury probe of Rahway municipal affairs, was indicted last week on charges of bribery, extortion, conspiracy to commit bribery and attempted bribery. The indictment charges Mr. Kinneally demanded a \$10,000 payoff on various dates in September and October of 1971 in order to help dispose of problems delaying granting of the variance sought by Heller.

Mr. Wollman was indicted on three charges of bribery, false swearing and conspiracy to obstruct justice. He was chairman of the Board of Adjustment when Mr. Wollman's term expired. Mr. Partillo faces 30 counts of perjury, conspiracy and extortion.

The indictments returned by the grand jury cover \$50,000 in alleged kickback demands made to William F. Heller Corporation of East Orange to build a Ramada Inn and an office structure at 1 Walnut Avenue, Clark.

The Billman Fifteen case is still before the Clark board of adjustment, having been remanded to the board by Superior Court Judge Milton A. Feller. Earlier this month Judge Feller reversed the Clark Council's action in granting a variance to the corporation and ordered further hearings by the board.

The suit to block the project was filed by the Southwest Civic Association of the township. Mr. Wollman and Mr. Kinneally have pleaded innocent.

Board Votes, 5-4, to Hire Counsel To Defend Appointment of Rizzo

The Rahway Board of Education voted, 5-4, on Monday night in Roosevelt School auditorium to retain Stewart M. Hurt of Woodbridge as special counsel to represent the board in the action started to have Louis R. Rizzo removed from the board.


