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Fewer Residents Of Union County Get Food Stamps

Participation by Union County residents in New Jersey's Food Stamp Program decreased in May as compared with April, according to the United States Department of Agriculture.

Participation in the state increased in May for the ninth consecutive month.

County participants purchased \$248,084 worth of stamps in May as compared with \$247,674 in April. The bonus value in May was \$192,519 as compared with \$191,058 in April.

There were 330,012 participants in the program throughout New Jersey in May as compared with 337,187 a month earlier.

Demand deposits, representing checking accounts, now total almost \$23 million, an increase of over \$5 million as compared to the same period last year.

Savings deposits have increased more than \$7 million over June 30, 1971, and are almost \$10 million.

The bank's total assets are reported at \$86.6 million, an increase over May 31 of \$13 million over last year's first half. Total net earnings for the period ending May 31, as of June 30, 1971 to date, are \$1.4 million, as of June 30, stated Robert Rockhill, president.

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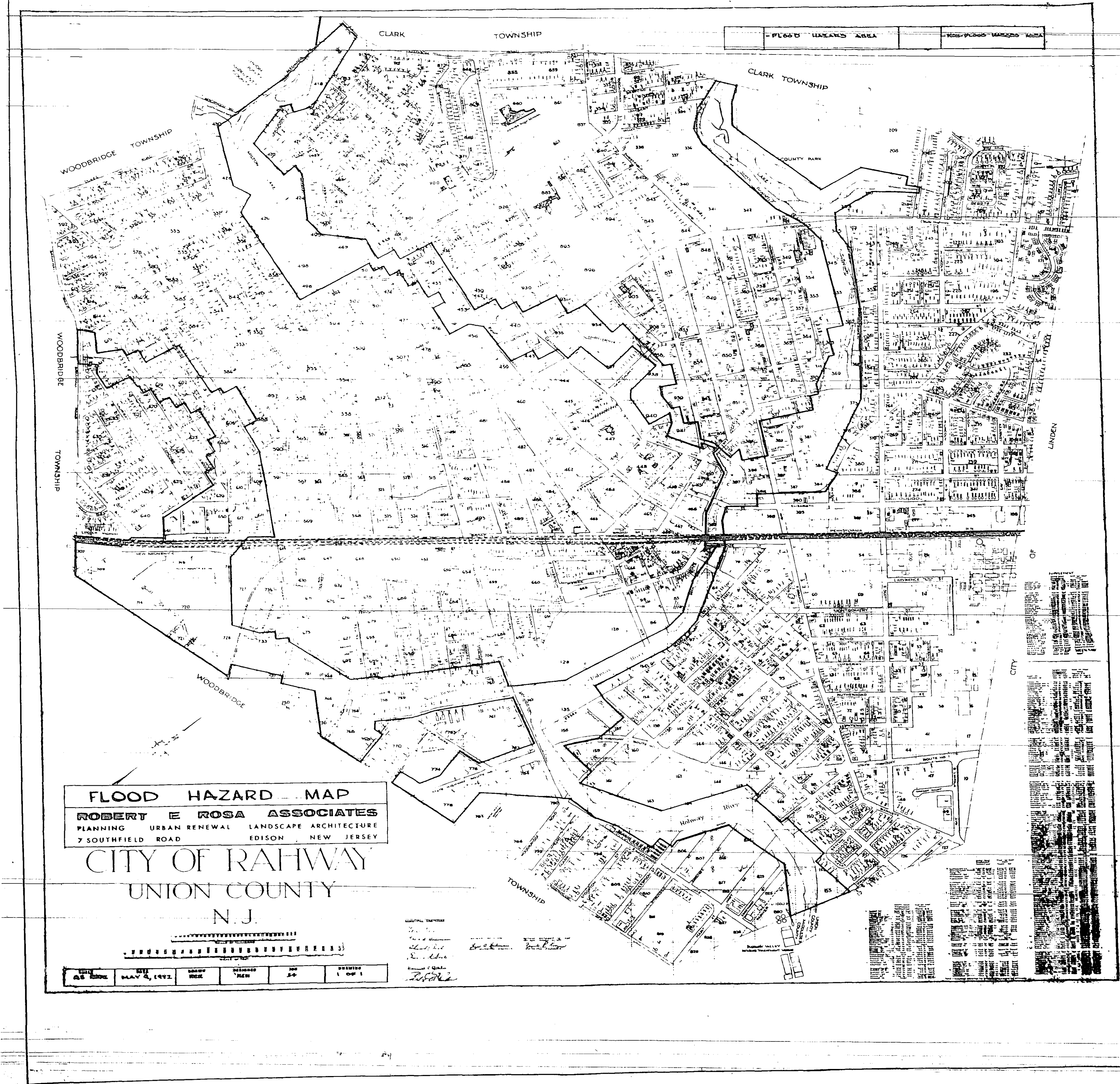

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the following Ordinance was adopted and approved at final reading at a regular meeting of Municipal Council, City of Rahway, New Jersey, Monday, evening, July 10, 1972.

AN ORDINANCE DELINEATING AND REGULATING USE AND BUILDING IN FLOODWAYS AND FLOOD HAZARD AREAS WITHIN THE CITY OF RAHWAY, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE City Council of the City of Rahway, in the County of Union and State of New Jersey:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE

This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as "The Flood Hazard Ordinance of the City of Rahway."

SECTION 2. PURPOSE AND POLICY

It is hereby found that the Rahway River and its North and South Branches and its tributaries, Robinson's Branch and its tributaries and other streams and tributaries in the City of Rahway are subject to recurrent flooding, that such flooding endangers life and damages public and private property and facilities, that this condition is aggravated by developments and encroachments in the flood plain, and that the most appropriate method of alleviating such condition is through regulation of such developments and encroachments. It is, therefore, declared that the special and paramount public interest in the flood plain justifies the regulation of property located therein, as provided in this ordinance, which is in the exercise of the police power of the municipality for the protection of the persons and property of its inhabitants, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare.

Among the purposes of this ordinance are:

- (a) to prevent loss of life;
- (b) to prevent installation of structures which increase flood heights;
- (c) to prevent excessive property damage;
- (d) to protect the public health;
- (e) to reduce public expenditures for emergency operations, evacuations and restorations;
- (f) to remove the impediment to community growth created by current flooding; and
- (g) to prevent further adverse development in unprotected flood plains, thus reducing future expenditures for protective measures.

It is also hereby found that the Federal Insurance Administration has identified the flood plain area having special flood hazards and has provided water surface elevations for the 100-year flood but has not provided data sufficient to identify the floodway.

SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS

FLOODWAY. The channel and portions of the adjacent flood plain that carry the greater flow of flood flow at greater depths and velocities than do the other parts of the flood plain, and constitute the minimum free flow for the passage of flood flows without aggravating flood conditions upstream and downstream, and that are necessary to preserve the natural regimen of the river. Encroachments into floodways established by the N.J. Department of Water Policy and Supply shall be considered as violations of this ordinance.

FLOOD HAZARD AREA. The area of the flood plain that is subject to flood flow at lesser depths and lower velocities than the floodway, and which is determined by the Floodway.

FLOODPROOFING. Floodproofing shall embody those procedures as detailed in the booklet "Introduction to Floodproofing" published by the Center of Urban Studies, University of Chicago, Illinois.

SECTION 4. GENERAL REGULATIONS

ENCROACHMENTS. No new or existing building, structure, or structure, including land fill, shall be permitted within the flood hazard area, as designated on the Flood Hazard Map, unless the applicant for the land use has obtained an encroachment permit from the Planning Board. Any existing building, structure, or structure, including land fill, shall be permitted within the flood hazard area, as designated on the Flood Hazard Map, only if the alteration or repair below the level of the 100-year flood is floodproofed, including any new utility and sanitary facilities.

FLOODWAY. No use, building, or structure, including land fill, shall be permitted within the floodway, as designated on the Flood Hazard Map, except that any of the following uses shall be permitted within the floodway and under such conditions as they would also be permitted by the Zoning Ordinance and other ordinances of the City of Rahway:

- (a) agricultural uses in the nature of farming, grazing, livestock raising, horticulture, and other similar uses;
- (b) recreational uses in the nature of parks, playgrounds, outdoor shooting ranges, and other similar uses;
- (c) commercial uses in the nature of parking areas, landfills, and other similar uses;

FLOOD HAZARD AREA. When an encroachment into the flood hazard area is proposed, the applicant shall submit to the Planning Board a plan showing the location of the proposed encroachment and the location of the flood hazard area, as designated on the Flood Hazard Map.

ENCROACHMENT. Any use, building, or structure, including land fill, which is not permitted by the Zoning Ordinance and other ordinances of the City of Rahway, and which is located within the flood hazard area, as designated on the Flood Hazard Map, shall be considered an encroachment.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT. A permit issued by the Planning Board, which authorizes the applicant to encroach into the flood hazard area, as designated on the Flood Hazard Map, for the purpose of carrying out the use, building, or structure, including land fill, which is not permitted by the Zoning Ordinance and other ordinances of the City of Rahway.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT APPLICATION. An application submitted to the Planning Board, which requests the issuance of an encroachment permit, and which includes the information required by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT FEE. A fee payable by the applicant for the issuance of an encroachment permit, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT EXPIRATION DATE. The date on which an encroachment permit expires, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT RENEWAL. The process by which an encroachment permit is renewed, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT CANCELLATION. The process by which an encroachment permit is cancelled, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT REVOCATION. The process by which an encroachment permit is revoked, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT SUSPENSION. The process by which an encroachment permit is suspended, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT REINSTATEMENT. The process by which an encroachment permit is reinstated, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT TRANSFER. The process by which an encroachment permit is transferred, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT ASSIGNMENT. The process by which an encroachment permit is assigned, and which is determined by the Planning Board.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT DEED. The process by which an encroachment permit is deeded, and which is determined by the Planning Board.
