## City to get a new railroad-station building

Computers at New Jersey Transit's Rahway Station will benefit from the construction of a new railroad station building, a project authorized this week by the corporation's Board of Directors.

The board awarded a \$12.6 million contract—funded by the state Transportation Trust Fund—to Hill Construction Co. of Wall to perform demolition work and construct a new building, high-level platforms, elevators and a pedestrian-tunnel at Rahway, a busy commuter station on the Northeast corridor and a key transfer point for commuters bound for the Jersey Shore on NJ Transit's North Jersey Coast Line.

NJ Transit Executive Director Shirley A. DeLibero said, "Over 2,500 passengers use Rahway Station each day. The building has been deteriorating over the past several years, and is in need of immediate attention." She added that the board's action will provide a customer-friendly environment to all rail passengers at this heavily utilized station.

NJ Transit worked closely with local officials on the design of the new station building. The project will include the construction of a new station building with a 1,100-square-foot waiting room, two accessible bathrooms, two new elevators, reconfiguration of the existing pedestrian tunnel, reconstruction of the eastbound and westbound platforms, stairwells, canopies and waiting areas, and site improvements around the station building.

According to city officials, many of the improvements will bring the station into compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act.

The work will be divided into six phases to allow for the continued operation of the station during construction. According to officials, work is expected to begin during the fall and is scheduled for completion in the summer of 1998.

"This project will be a tremendous benefit to Rahway from an economic development standpoint," said Rahway Mayor James J. Kennedy. "The station sits in the midst of the business district and will add to the vitality of the city. It also enables us to better market the land surrounding the station area."

"Design work for the station was started in 1992 by The Ives Group of Fair Lawn. The Ives Group will continue to perform construction assistance work for the duration of the project.

Train service in Rahway dates back to 1852. The major station and high-level platforms were constructed in the 1920s when electrified rail service was introduced on the Northeast corridor.

In addition, the station building underwent an extensive reconstruction project in 1974 when the waiting room was moved from street level to the mezzanine level and ticket offices were moved from street level to platform level.

NJ Transit is New Jersey's public transportation corporation, providing bus, rail and light-rail services to about 316,500 passengers daily. Honored as "best-in-the-nation" by the American Public Transit Association, it is the nation's third largest provider of bus and commuter rail service, operating 582 daily trains on 13 rail lines and offering more than 13,300 daily trips on 170 bus routes statewide.

## Library to hook-up

**Automated card catalog to be installed**

The Rahway Public Library will be getting an automated card catalog which is scheduled to be up and running toward the end of the summer of 1996, replacing its previously traditional filing system.

Library director Keith McCoy says that the system will actually be shared with another local library. It will consist of 16 or 17 terminals, two of which will be available to the public. Three or four of these terminals will be centrally located while the remaining shall be scattered throughout the building.

McCoy said he also hopes to place terminals at City Hall and the Senior Citizens Center.

McCoy explained that instead of looking up a book by hand according to either a title in the files of the card catalog, now residents will be able to simply type in a particular author, title or even an entire subject. For example, if someone entered "baseball" as a subject heading, the computer would display all the titles the library has that refer to the subject of baseball.

Seemingly endless searching through those little index cards will be completely eliminated. There also will be no need for the pad and pencil when looking up titles since users will be able to print out any screen they happen to be viewing.

Eventually, McCoy said he would like the system to provide Internet access, including a page on the World Wide Web. Inquiring as to the availability of a certain book, for example, also will be possible by means of a dial-in access feature. The library is not a place for books, it's a place for information, said city spokesman Jeff Joia.

Although the newly automated card catalog will serve as a vast improvement over its predecessor, in ease of use and convenience, McCoy said he still feels strongly that it is the actual books, videos and community programs that will decide whether or not residents make use of the establishment.

The cost of such an undertaking is an estimated \$125,000, which McCoy considers affordable.

This is not the first time the technology game has been played at the Rahway Public Library. Since he was hired in June 1993, McCoy has accelerated the implementation process of numerous advancements such as energy-efficient lighting, new carpeting and the installation of a theft detection system.

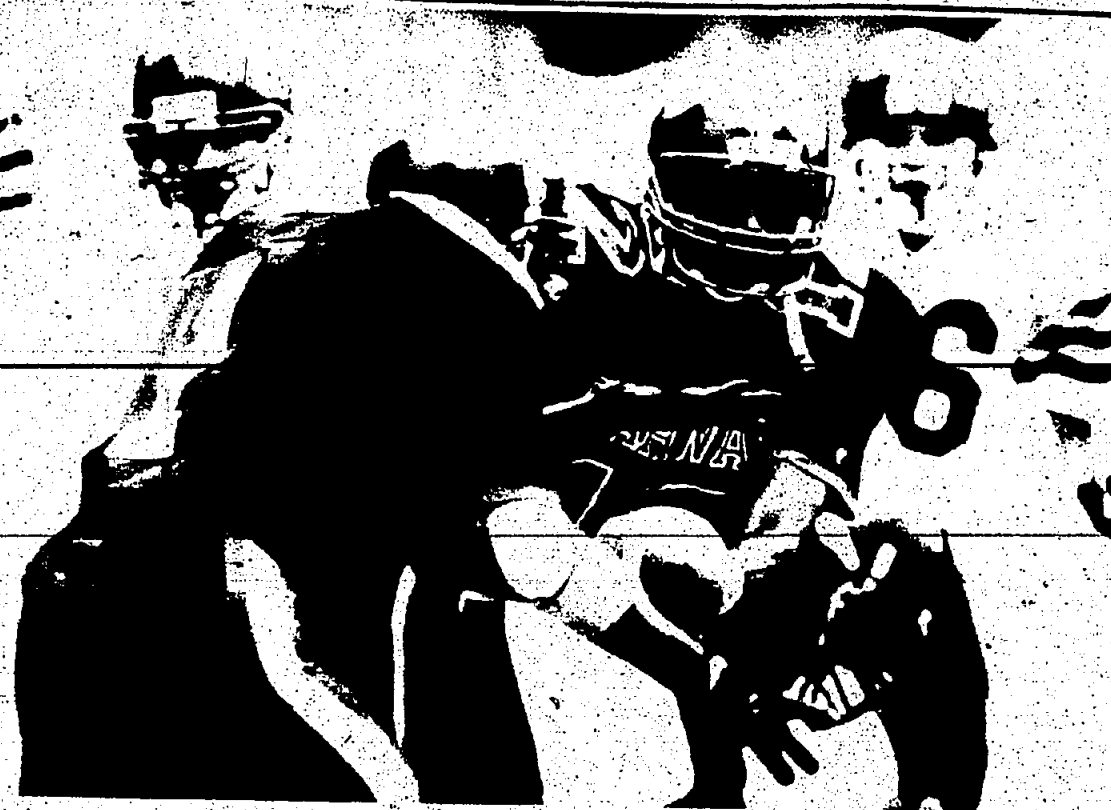

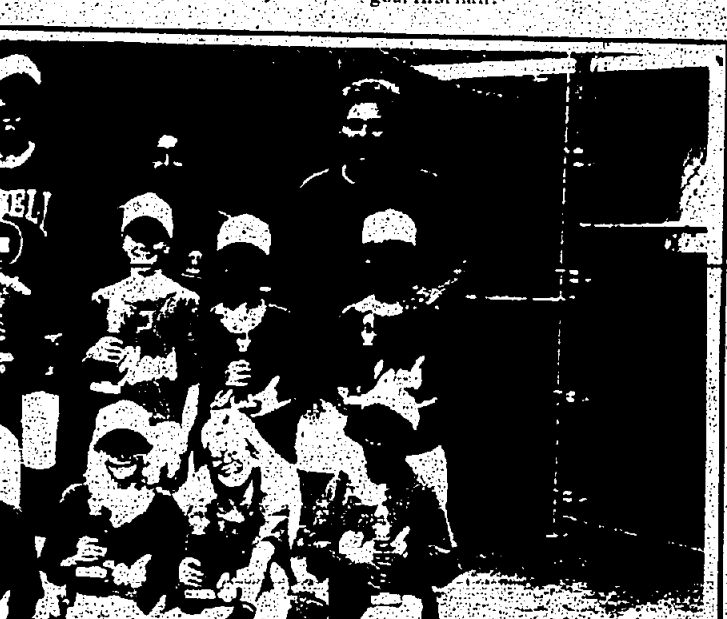

## From The Editor's Notebook

A purple drape has been hanging outside the Union County Administration Building for a week, marking the death of Union County Prosecutor Andrew Ruotolo Jr.

While the purple drape will remind us of his death, the second floor of the administration building will remind us of his life, and all the energy he put into making Union County a safer place to live for its residents—adults and children alike.

When one thinks of law enforcement in Union County, one should think of Ruotolo. He has made that much of a difference as the county's top law enforcement officer in the four years he had been prosecutor. His courage and passion for law without politics, and his command of the respect of Democrats and Republicans throughout the county.

My interaction with Ruotolo was always on a business-to-business level. In one of those instances, I learned the kind of man he truly was—and earned a deeper respect for him.

I had called his office two years ago to follow up on a story I had been writing about the death of Eileen Chenka, a former councilwoman in Roselle Park who worked for the Prosecutor's Office. Chenka died after being struck by a vehicle on Westfield Avenue in Roselle Park.

As her boss, Ruotolo was someone I wanted to talk to about Chenka. His remarks I felt were important to my story. When I reached him on the telephone, I explained the purpose of the call, and only moments later, I realized I did not have the county's top law enforcement officer on the other end, but a man, someone who cared a great deal about an individual's life.

There was silence for a few moments before Ruotolo's voice, obviously cracking, asked if he could bring his remarks and fax them to me. He could not get the words out loud, but he was not afraid to admit that I understood.

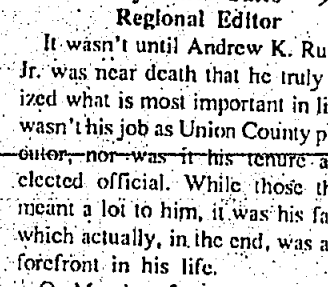
It was so unlike the other times I had heard his company. He pinned the Worrall Newspapers on Sunday afternoon two years ago and participated in a Union County Roundtable, sponsored by this company and aired on Suburban Cablevision. The purpose of the Roundtable was to convene Union County's top government leaders and activists and have them explain to their constituents some of the problems facing the county, and some of the ways to overcome the obstacles to be one of the top counties in the state.

Ruotolo had a commanding presence and captured not only his audience, but the panel members as well.

In another instance, I saw him stand before Jim Florio during a press conference on the assault weapons ban. In the Prosecutor's Office that day were various kinds of assault weapons—weapons he admitted he feared.

He also thought of the children of the county and had their best interests in mind. He had a mandatory annual in-service training for every law enforcement

It wasn't until Andrew K. Ruotolo Jr. was near death that he truly realized what is most important in life. It wasn't this job as Union County prosecutor, nor was it his name as an elected official. While those things meant a lot to him, it was his family which actually, in the end, was at the forefront in his life.

On Monday afternoon, the 42-year-old Ruotolo was laid to rest at Fairview Cemetery, not far from his Westfield home. While his family, among an assemblage of dignitaries and friends, mourned Ruotolo's passing, his daughters, Lyndsay, 13, and Hylene, 8, and son, Andrew, 10, could at least take solace in the fact that it was they who were most important to their now departed father.

And, of course, there was Mary, his wife, who played a major role in his life, not only nurturing him, but also three children in happier times, but standing sternly alongside him right up until death.

This message was sounded over and over again during Monday morning's ceremony at St. Helen's Roman Catholic Church in Westfield.

Hundreds of law enforcement officers, including police chiefs from each of the municipalities in Union County and members of the Essex-Union Anti-Theft Task Force, waited outside the church for the arrival of the casket containing Ruotolo so they could greet the county's "top cop" with a salute and a shower of flowers.

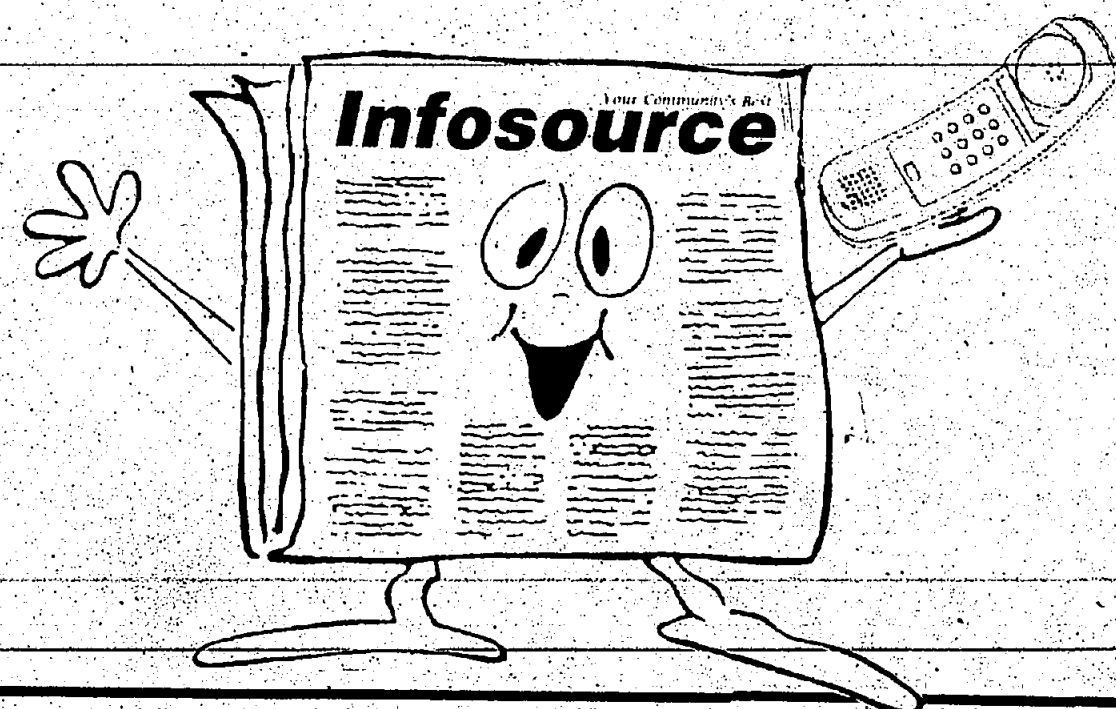

(Continued from Page B1) In a way as if to say "You mean the merry-go-round is slowing down now?"

Also, Hudson noted Ruotolo's struggle to come to grips with "his God" and it wasn't until his last day at the hospital that Ruotolo asked Hudson if he could go to church to receive communion with his family. "I said, 'Yes you can, God's been waiting for you for a long time,'" said Hudson.

The reverend noted that there are no guarantees in life there will even be a tomorrow. Ruotolo became aware of that, said Hudson, if he knew he was going to die, he would have hugged and kissed everyone he loved and clung onto them.

Hudson told attendees they should take something with them when they leave the church — an "awareness."

Three of Ruotolo's closest friends — Union County First Assistant Prosecutor Michael Lapolla, long-time friend and former law partner Joseph Mella and attorney Stephen Morosoni — eulogized the fallen prosecutor.

In an emotional speech, Mella noted that Ruotolo always kept a picture of his late wife, Kathleen, on his desk. Mella noted that Ruotolo on his deathbed was thinking of his children, his friends, his wife and his family.

Ruotolo's friends told him "we'd never laugh again," said another friend, but they would laugh again, but they would never be young again. That's the way I feel today.

Ruotolo, said Mella, struggled hard to achieve what he had in life, and he struggled equally with death. "He taught us how to live and he taught us how to die," said Mella. "He lost his struggle with death, but he won his struggle with life."

Mella said Ruotolo, rather than seeing his life as coming to a crashing halt, saw it for what it was. His only ambition became to be with his family.

Lapolla, who chose to direct his remarks to Ruotolo's children, had to wipe tears away from his eyes during his speech. After offering individual remarks to each of the children, Lapolla said he was trying to imagine what heaven would be like for their father. Lapolla said he thought it would be a cross between Cape Cod and Westfield and include activities such as golf and windsurfing of which Ruotolo was fond, and weekly, press conferences with Bill and Honor.

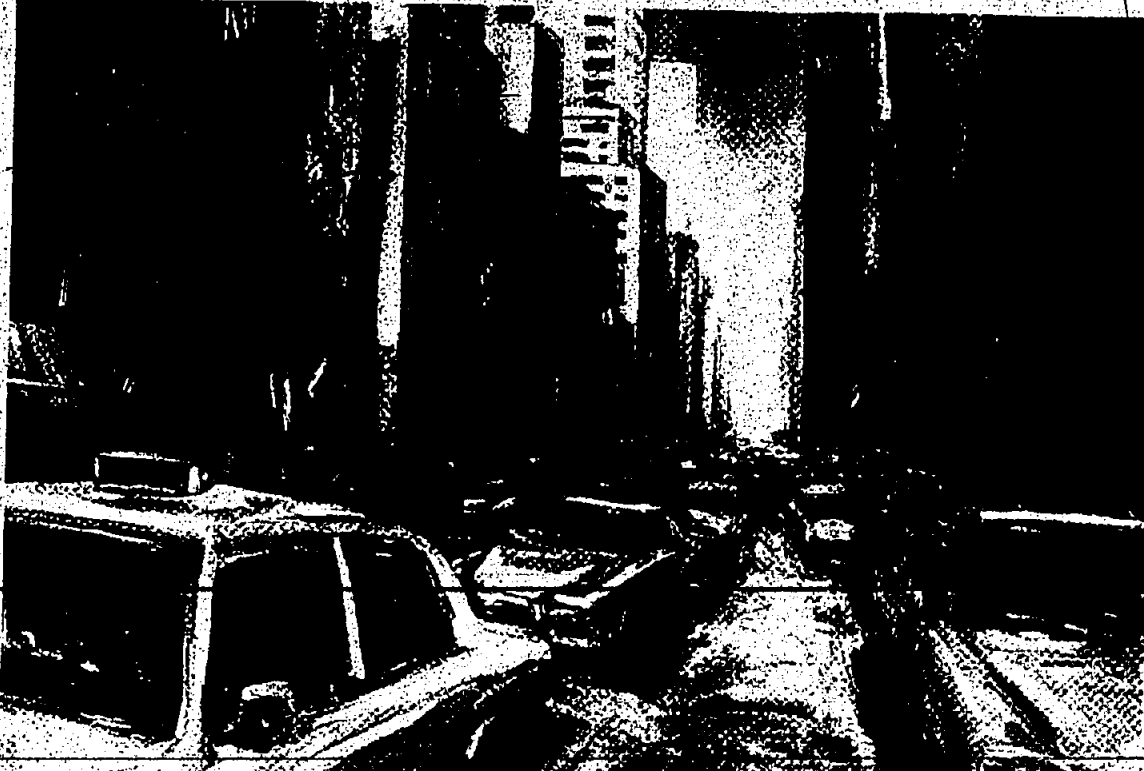

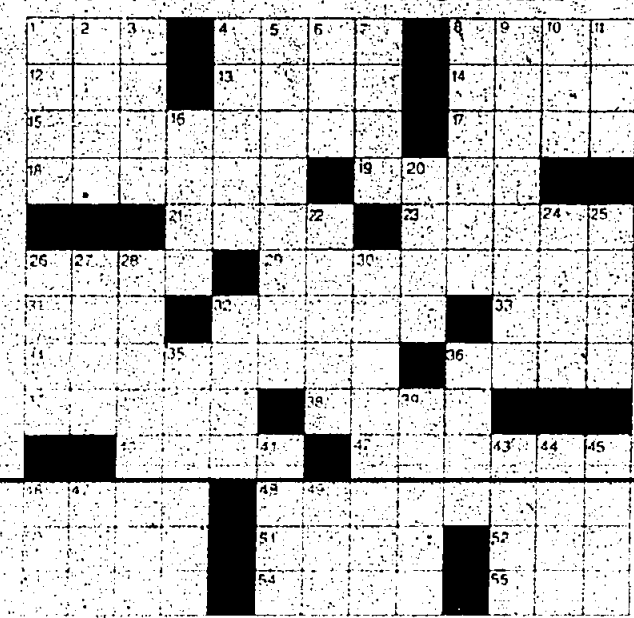
