The parable is particularly applicabl to present times when so many splen-did talents are allowed to lie idle, undeveloped and unincreased. If each this kind could only be made to realize how much good we could do if our gift were improved and perfected, perhaps there would be fewer "slothful serv.

there would be fewer "slothful serv-ants" among us. Talent, perfected and used toward a good end, is 'power. Why not make use of this power, then, that is onry merely for the training of our talents?
