Councilman Buckley said that the best way to settle the matter would be to return the \$10 he paid by Mr. Harrison for opening the street, compel Mr. Hitchcock to take his sewer line across Central Avenue, and sever through that section of Central Avenue. The sewer in that thoroughfare now extends as far as Elizabeth Street, and the next time some temporary relief should be given Mr. Harrison will be advised that the drainage committee will, Mr. Verney said, see an amicable solution to the problem.

Attorney Dobkins said that the matter was more in the nature of a civil suit and advised the return of the \$10 to Mr. Harrison, who said he had no objection to such a ruling.
