In order that the citizens of Rahway may have accurate and definite to ormation concarning the assessments levied on the taxable property broughout the city which will give them ample opportunity to judge whether there is need of greater equalization The Record has undertaken the gigantic task of publishing the antire list of properties in the city which numbers about 13,000 holdings. Some time ago a complete list of the personal property taxes was published and now the list of real estate and buildings is given. By comparison with pieces of property of which he has definite knowledge the citizen can readily arrive at some opinion as to the proper value of a piece of property and can decide whether the burden is properly squalized throughout the city. Taxing methods in a large measure determine the progress and prosperity of a city and for that reason The Record has planned to publish the entire property holdings in all of the five wards of the city. Some of the wards may be published complete to a single issue while others will have to be divided into two or three installments ac-






