WINTER WHEAT HINTS.

TAIN THE FEE AT BREEDING TIME. The C's best feeding of the flock at this visibility. **Breeding Essential.** United States Department of Agriculture has issued a circular for the valley size breeding season for ewes begins Oct. 1st. The first cold night at this time the lamb will be born. At that time the lamb will begin to come in heat, although in the flock breeds this period occurs. Periods in which the ewes will breed last from "Reed to three days and return again." The gestation period is 147 days. Ewes should be mated to drop their lambs in the C's first month after the lambing date in November.

FEEDING TURKEYS. Preparing for the winter should begin with winter light feedings. United States Department of Agriculture has issued a circular for the market excellent plan is to begin about Oct. 1st to feed night and morning, not enough at a time, but that the birds will eat more. Between the towns of standing corn, in northern Minnesota, the winter wheat may also follow some early crop such as barley, oats or early potato. Farmers provided they use of the land early plowing to permit plowing and early sowing of winter wheat.

EARLY PLOWING. Early plowing of stubble land is essential to a good crop. It helps to improve the soil, and gradually increasing the quantity until they are given all they need enough to kill the birds should be fed. By the latter feeding is intended that they leave the food and walk away.
