Mayor Furber and the City Planning Commission composed of representative citizens send the ratification of this purchase which they advocated and which was bought under an ordinance passed unanimously by the three-city commissions, because they feel that it means progress to the city. The opposition to the purchase holds that there are too many other big projects demanding the attention of the city and involving large expenditures of money to make it feasible to send upwards of \$16,000 for park lands, which they believe the city can get for less.

They figure the Union County Park Commission will ultimately take over the two projects in line with the \$150,000 city park expenditures authorized by vote of the public and now in the process of development.
