The new payment from Central avenue to the bridge along New Church street is completed, and Commissioner Hoff has been commended by the hundreds of persons who have had occasion to already use it, for his attention and consideration of the needs of a community improvement.

At a meeting of the Civic Club held Thursday afternoon last, the president, Mrs. L. A. W. Milbury, in commenting upon the unsatisfactory condition of the city's milk supply, pointed out that various city officials had "passed the buck" when she sought to get information on the milk situation. This is not surprising when it is considered that the city has no organized health board.
There seems to be quite a discrepancy between the alleged statement of Mayor James H. Parker that "milk tests were made quite frequently," and the letter received by an official of the Rayway Civic Club, from the State Department of Health to the effect that "the milk had been examined on March 15, nine months ago." But it all depends on how you interpret the meaning of the word "frequently."

But why get excited because of the fact that, according to a letter sent Mayor Parker from the State Department of Health on March 14th last, that "two of the samples of milk collected from the Municipal Milk Stations were found to differ from the legal standard." Health matters seem to be of secondary importance to the mayor, judging from his attitude and apparent indifference since the appointment of the Board of Health. What matters it if we have an epidemic of disease. The mayor's health officer says: "If you want a good job of plumbing, get a plumber to do it in when you have convenient." If a neighbor complains about a back yard nuisance let him become tired of notifying the health officer, through the mayor's indifference, and finally drop the matter entirely. It has been proved that the nuisance wasn't so bad after all.

Secretary of State Thomas F. Martin, in an address made before the Holy Name Society of St. James Church, Newark, last week, made some very pointed remarks concerning the Ku Klux Klan members who have been meeting throughout the State this last six months. Among other things he said: "The Ku Klux Klan's attitude toward Roman Catholics, Jews and others they oppose reminds me of the story of two brothers who went hunting and were caught in a fog in Norway. As they groped their way about, seeking landmarks to get back to the highlands, one of them with a huge mass coming toward them. One said, 'Let's run before it catches us.' The other said, 'No, we can't run fast enough. Let's go back and kill it whatever it is.' So loading their rifles the boys were prepared to fight the strange apparition. The mass was suddenly the fog lifted and the figure of a boy was seen. He had been seeking the others to rescue them."

RESULT COUNT
Vice-Chairman Frankford of Committee on Public Relations of Eastern Railroads says that 2 1/2 years since end of federal control, railway management has succeeded in reducing operating expenses about \$1,000,000,000 a year, about one-third of having come from reduced wages and one-third from increased efficiency and economy. In 1922 railroads required 1,621,210 employees to produce transportation, whereas in 1929 they required 1,129,725. They have thus saved 2,103,185. More than half this saving has been turned over to the public in reduced rates.
