




Under the new plan, customers will receive their bills monthly within a few days-instead of ten days or two weeks-after meters are read, thus enabling them to keep a closer check on consumption of electricity and gas, and make more timely comparisons of bills with their household or business budget.

## With More Than a Million Electric and Gas Customers, New Plan is Necessary

As a result of the process of readjustment approximately one-half of the October bills will cover a period of less than one month, about one-third will cover a period of one month, and the balance, or one sixth of the bills, will cover a period of more than one month.

All subsequent bills, after the readjustment is made, will cover a period of one month each; they will be delivered within a fewdays after readings are taken each month and on approximately the same date every

Customer accounts to be transferred to the new system in November, December or January will be affected similarly to those transferred in October, with allowance made for the difference in time of the trans-
