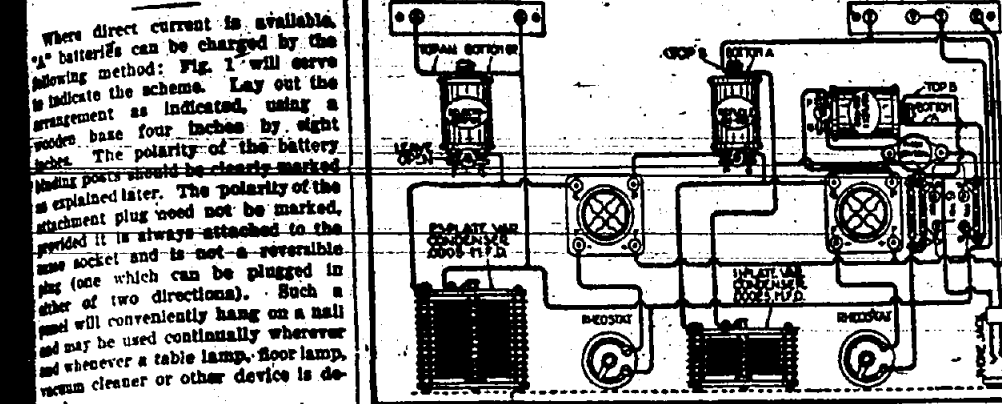

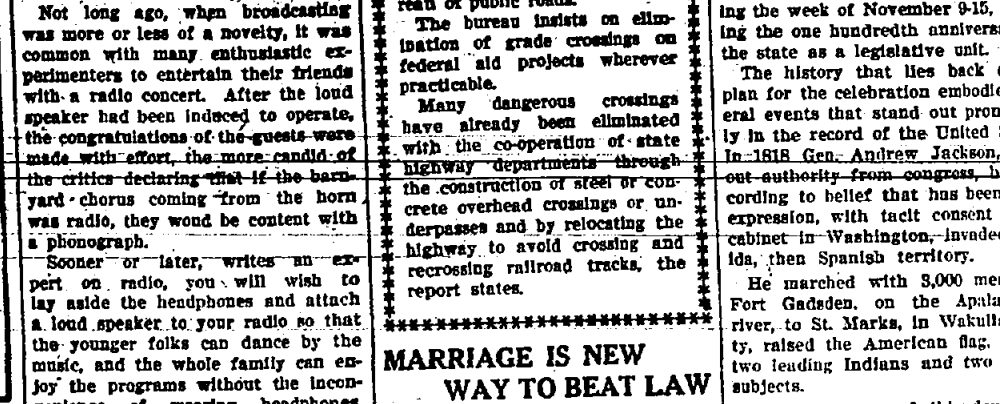

COLLEGE FRESHMEN TO UNDERGO TEST

Psychological Check Is Devised by Educators.

Chicago—Psychological tests prepared from material furnished by five of the principal universities of America, will be given to freshmen of more than a hundred colleges and universities, and will present a new step to improve present methods of determining who are the best and who the dull students.

The new tests, together with the descriptions of the tests, which are said to be the most thorough of any in the history of educational psychology, will be given to freshmen of more than a hundred colleges and universities, and will present a new step to improve present methods of determining who are the best and who the dull students.

It has been generally admitted, according to Dr. Thurstone, that present-day entrance examinations and requirements are inadequate to indicate the bright students or eliminate the unskilled. Brigham, Princeton university.) "Common sense situations." (Submitted by Dr. C. C. Brigham, Princeton university.) "English grammar test." (Submitted by Dr. C. C. Brigham, Princeton university.)

Not Sanely Treated. "These are not tests of sanity," Dr. Thurstone explains, "but tests to determine whether a student is capable of doing college work."

If they are not doing the type of work which the tests indicate, the college deans will be able to find out what is wrong. Out of these love affairs, or financial difficulties prove obstacles in the way of standard college work. When the deans understand, he will be able to get at the problem and to aid in its solution."
