For centuries, essential oils have been extracted from flowers and used in perfume.

The process of general use in extracting the essential oil of flowers is to take their perfume in called enfleurage. A housewife, who understands how to use her fingers in the process, will sometimes absorb oils from flowers and use them in perfume.

The other system adopted after enfleurage is called distillation. In this process, the flowers are placed in a still and steam is used to extract the oils. This process is used for many months until the flowers are completely dried.
