No Mail Deliveries Christmas Day

Widespread approval has greeted the recent announcement of the Postmaster General that there will be no mail deliveries on Christmas Day.

Almost without exception the American public has agreed with the Federal Justice of the rails which gives to the army of postal employees some of the holiday privileges accorded other employees, but so long delayed.

The Postmaster General has long been the subject of criticism for his policy of no mail deliveries on Christmas Day.

Under the leadership of the Postmaster General, a campaign is now under way throughout the country to install in the minds of everybody the necessity for shopping and mailing early in order that there will be no little congestion at the post offices as possible during Christmas week and in order that the best service and prompt delivery of gifts and remittances may be assured.

The record shows that attention of the public to the fact that if Christmas shopping is left until the very last minute, the eleventh hour shoppers get what other people have left. There is no selection of gifts from which to make satisfactory purchases.

And it is likewise true that if you put off your mailing until the very last minute, the congestion that always takes place at Christmas time will be bound to delay the prompt delivery of your gifts on the day intended by the sender.

To insure that your remittances will be in the hands of your friends make your purchases early and turn them over to the employees of the postal service at once. By doing so you will be happy and those to whom they are intended will have something to interfere with their holiday "joy" at Christmas.

Zoning "Enabling Act"

According to the Secretary of Commerce, Howard C. Hughes, in an enabling act which states that the Federal Government has authorized the municipalities to draw zoning ordinances and enforce them. To date several New Jersey cities have adopted this act. Our own State of New Jersey has failed to act on this bill, but it is hoped by those having the interests of New Jersey at heart that the Garden State will early follow suit.

Secretary Hughes' statement, delivered in his annual report is as follows:

"An advisory committee on zoning was appointed by the Secretary of Commerce in 1921 to deal with another aspect of municipal building regulations. The standard State zoning enabling act which this committee prepared has been widely used in many States, and it is now being considered by the Federal Government as a model for the States to follow."

"Reports indicate that zoning ordinances have been helpful in cities throughout the country in avoiding the blighting of districts and the unnecessary scrapping of buildings and costly public utilities that are all too common. The raising of a single block of dwellings and the occupancy of utility companies unused for altered purposes usually involved a destruction of \$100,000 or more worth of property, depending on the number and character of houses. Where the scale of such operations is reduced by a good zoning ordinance the annual savings, even in a city of moderate size, are very considerable."

Chance for Railwaymen




