

Granges of State to Show Commercial Size Packages

To increase the demand for farm products in New Jersey, the Granges of the State will have an exhibit at the Trenton Fair during the week of September 25 to October 1.

A feature of the display will consist of produce in commercial size packages, the same as the average house hold. Many members of the Granges have felt that they are being a poor market to other States by failing to have the New Jersey fruit and produce presented to buyers in baskets and boxes of a smaller size. The exhibit at the fair will take the form of a demonstration for this reason.

Another attraction which will be featured again this year at the exposition will be the work of the boys' and girls' clubs and competing teams will be in attendance from all parts of the State. On Monday of the event the girls' judging and cutting judges will make the Coliseum an active scene.

Industrial Conference Draw Large Attendance

Between two and three hundred representatives of the State industrial concerns of New Jersey are expected to attend the Industrial Educational Conference which will be held at Rutgers University on September 15 and 16. Professor N. C. Miller, director of the Industrial Educational Conference, announced today that the attendance would probably double that of the first conference last year when 150 delegates were present. The policy of holding the annual sessions was inaugurated in the fall of 1926 primarily for service to the citizens of New Jersey in the belief that members of the extension staff of the State University may be in position to aid the representatives of large industrial concerns in their problems in their special fields.

The preliminary program as announced by Professor Miller includes addresses by several industrial leaders of national and international prominence. Addressing the conference will be Dr. J. H. Thompson and other prominent figures. The conference session on Wednesday will be devoted to a discussion of appropriate subjects. The Industrial Educational Conference is a joint project of the State University and the National Industrial Conference Board.

Jersey "Skeeters" Breed Profanity

It is estimated that several thousand yards in excess of the usual season's output of skeeters have been bred in this year in window screens, the reason being that this section of the State has been, by Rahwayans at least, to have a monopoly on the mosquito pest-killers.

Many of the skeeters have been bred from Rahwayans, and it is a safe bet that the Rahwayan breeders have had several assistants appointed in consequence.

The "question" is almost always asked: "Why do you breed skeeters?" The answer is: "Because they are so profitable." It is not surprising, for within the history of the oldest nation, have the mosquitoes been as troublesome as they are now.

Under the present constitution amendments must be submitted to the people at a special election. There is no reason why amendments should not be submitted to the voters at the regular general election, placed at the bottom of the ballot, when a much fuller vote can be obtained.

The fourth amendment provides for sessions of the Legislature every two years, and the necessary re-adjustment of the terms of Assemblymen, Senators and Governor to make such a plan workable.

The fact is, only four other states in the Union have sessions every year. Besides the popular demand for the plan, it will save the taxpayers the cost of the Legislature, besides reducing the number of laws and the confusion which results through changes of statutes.

It makes the terms of Assemblymen two years, instead of one as at present, and it would make the terms of Senators and the Governor four years, instead of three as at present, as in the case of all other states where sessions are held every two years.

The fifth amendment remedies a confusing defect in the present constitution in regard to the method of appointing County Judges, that they may continue to be appointed by the Governor, as was originally intended by a previous amendment, and not by the Legislature as appears in one section of the constitution.

Since the introduction of the Kew-Fish Kill bill, there have been the factors of many community moves, both pertaining to civic affairs, and also the humane idea of community life. But the act provides that a widow must have resided in the county from which she seeks aid five years before she comes within its provisions. That is, when the justice comes in. A couple with several children may be living in this State for four years and the breadwinner may be taken without having provided for the family. The law would not permit this widow and her children to receive any support.

Assemblyman Clift On the Amendments

Assemblyman John W. Clift of Union County, in a recent interview, said:

"The amendments of six years in the House of Assembly of this State, and twelve years in the clerical department of the State Senate, I am fully convinced that all five of the proposed amendments to the State Constitution should be adopted. They are non-partisan and for the best interest of all citizens, and will prove a saving of many thousands of dollars to the State."

"There are five amendments to be voted upon. The first is very important. It is the Zoning Amendment. This amendment is necessary to preserve the force of zoning regulations for the welfare of communities. The zoning laws are under the Constitution as it now stands, the Legislature has not the power to delegate the regulation of zoning to the governing bodies of municipalities. This amendment, if adopted, will give such power, which is vital to enforcement of zoning ordinances."

"The second is the District Amendment, which gives the Legislature power to pass laws that will allow a group of municipalities to organize a district unit for development of a water supply, a sewage disposal system, a drainage area or a new or reclamation district. It gives such newly created district the power to borrow money and purchase the water under a commission elected from the district."

"With the growth of our State, there are many sections that can no longer depend upon state or municipal water supplies or sewage disposal systems. These indispensable functions of civil life must be consolidated so that one district unit will provide such facilities for many municipalities."

"The third amendment provides for future amendments to the State Constitution. It is not surprising, for within the history of the oldest nation, have the mosquitoes been as troublesome as they are now."

Under the present constitution amendments must be submitted to the people at a special election. There is no reason why amendments should not be submitted to the voters at the regular general election, placed at the bottom of the ballot, when a much fuller vote can be obtained.

The fourth amendment provides for sessions of the Legislature every two years, and the necessary re-adjustment of the terms of Assemblymen, Senators and Governor to make such a plan workable.

The fact is, only four other states in the Union have sessions every year. Besides the popular demand for the plan, it will save the taxpayers the cost of the Legislature, besides reducing the number of laws and the confusion which results through changes of statutes.

It makes the terms of Assemblymen two years, instead of one as at present, and it would make the terms of Senators and the Governor four years, instead of three as at present, as in the case of all other states where sessions are held every two years.
