

FIRST CHURCH FORMS ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

**Innovation Will Shape Up At
Special Meeting Tonight**

Organization of church athletes will be undertaken by the membership of the First Presbyterian Church tonight when an athletic association, to promote and control the branch of work will be formed. The step marks an innovation in Rahway church circles.

The athletic program carried out last winter with the non-secularizable aid of the community house was so popular and otherwise successful that the need of an organization to give proper direction to the work was felt.

A program more complete in every respect than last year's will be put on this season. Rev. Chester M. Davis, the pastor, has announced. Under the new plan, each group will be able to conduct its own athletics. The work will be divided according to age, with special provisions for youth, boys and girls. Social events will be arranged in addition to special athletic games and matches with other churches.

Last year the church was represented by a basketball team coached by "Johnny" Brooks, former Brown University and coach of the 1924 and 1925 championship football eleven at Rahway High. The team won eighty per cent of the games played. A representative team of the church is expected to join this month.

Design of Colonial Clock Tells Its Age

An interesting history of the clock is given by Walter Randolph Story in Arts and Decorative Magazine. "No one bit of furniture gives quite as cheerful and quaint a note to a room as does a Colonial clock. There is a distinct decorative quality in a hands or tree-clock on the wall, a grandfather clock in the corner, or an early shelf clock on the fireplace mantel. These interesting relics of Colonial times, still ticking away, never tell what they have seen years ago. Their round, friendly faces and dignified forms hint of farmhouses with log-cabin outbuildings, or Georgian mansions with busy clock.

"The earliest tick clocks had plaited wheels. Around 1700 the face was decorated with three balls or some other form of ornament, the middle ball being placed higher than those at the sides. Later the clock was placed on the wall with the broken arch, so popular in Colonial cabinet work, as well as the scroll top, came into the fashion of the day.

"If your clock has a square metal dial it is likely to be of the Georgian, Federal or Empire period. After the beginning of the nineteenth century that the arch above the dial appeared, but the moving more, of leaving-clip. MYSTERY PEARLS PLAY PART IN LIFE OF BARON'S FAMILY

**Legend Says They Were Given to
German Ambassador's Ancest-
or by Goblins**

Berlin—A mysterious string of pearls plays a remarkable role in the history of the family of Baron Ago von Maltzan, German ambassador to the United States, according to baroness Louise Moltke-Maltzan, aunt of the ambassador.

A legend says the pearls, which are in the possession of the Maltzan branch of the family, were presented by a goblin in 1083 to baroness Iva Regina Maltzan in the ancestral castle at Miltitz, in Silesia.

One night, the legend goes, while the baroness was beside the cradle of her first-born child, a goblin rose up out of the ground and asked her to move the lamp to some other corner of the room. He explained that the oil from the lamp was dripping on the bed of his grandchild, which, he said, was not good for the child. He was directly visible to human eyes, was directly visible to the baroness, and she complied with the request of the supernatural visitor.

Five days later the grateful goblin reappeared—and made her a present of a string of pearls. He said they would bring luck to the family as long as their color was unchanged and they remained in the possession of the Maltzan family. "Should the pearls change color, however," he warned, "it means that the head of some branch of the family will die."

The story continues that in 1010 Joachim Maltzan, in an attempt to win other members of the family as to the material of which the pearls were made, mutilated one of them. Thereupon there was an earthquake, accompanied by lightning, killing five persons on the Maltzan estate.

In 1500 a sister of the then owner of the pearls was in financial straits and offered them to the grandfather of the present ambassador. The latter, however, refused them to his Silesian cousin, their rightful owner.

It is claimed that the pearls still continue to change color when death occurs in the family. They are treasured carefully at Miltitz as a talisman, the continued possession of which is to bring luck to the family.

Scots Plan Festival in Canadian Rockies

Banff, Alberta.—With a hundred medals of gold, silver and bronze offered for supremacy in singing, dancing, games and sports, the Scottish communities in the Canadian west are looking forward with keen interest to the Highland gathering and Scottish music festival which is being organized for the first week in September at Banff, and to which the Prince of Wales has given his patronage.

Although there have been highly successful Scottish games held in various parts of Canada, there have been mostly of local interest and lasting a single day, but the Banff gathering is expected to last three days and will have a national character. Each of the 17 Highland regiments in Canada has been authorized to send a pipe to compete for the trophy for regimental piping offered by H. W. Beatty, president of the Canadian Pacific railway.

MANUFACTURE OF PAPER

A LTHOUGH the word "paper" is derived from papyrus, the writing material of ancient peoples, papyrus is not paper, nor does the making of paper date back to it. The first genuine paper was made by the Chinese in very early times and introduced by them to the Arabs, and thence into Europe. There is knowledge of a factory established for the purpose of making paper at Samarra as early as 700 A. D.

By the Arabs the art of turning flax and cotton into paper was thought to have been taken first into Spain and then into Italy. The year 1150 saw the establishment of the paper mill at Fabriano, which became the center of a great paper-making district. After Italy came France, Germany, and when the Bolet of Saintes in 1283 drove French paper makers into exile, England and America fell into the net.

In the year 1590 the first paper mill in America was built at Roxbury, near Philadelphia, by William Littenbrough. The story of the manufacture of paper would be incomplete without mention of the Founding fathers, Benjamin Franklin, who in the early Nineteenth century lost their fortune in the invention of a machine for producing paper in endless rolls, instead of the old individual sheets, a machine which revolutionized the industry and earned for them the title "the fathers of modern paper-making."

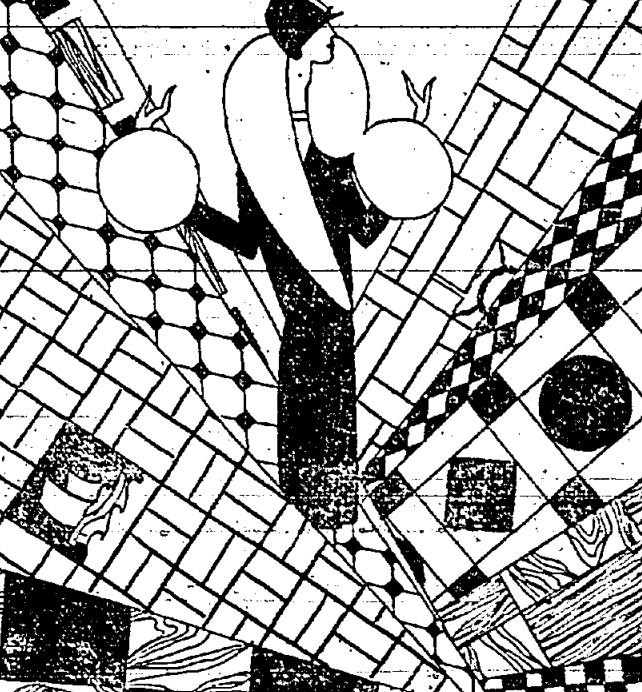
