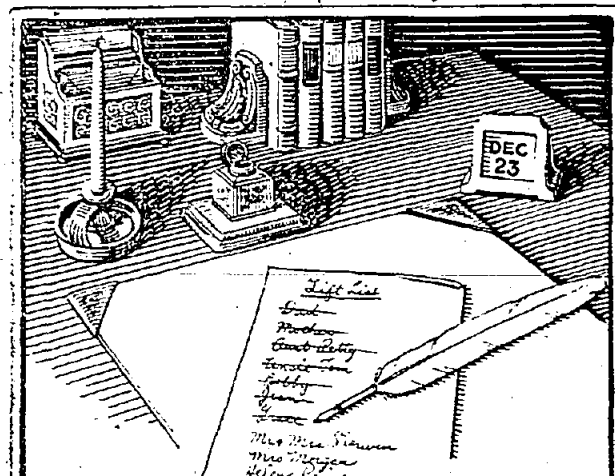

### Williams Reports Healthy Community; No Contagions

Only one case of contagious disease existed in Rahway in November, according to the report of Health Inspector Fred M. Williams, prepared to be submitted to the Board of Health Tuesday night. The meeting of the board was postponed until tonight, owing to the fact that some of the members were unable to be present.

In addition to reporting only one case of contagious disease, Mr. Williams reports thirteen marriages, twenty births and fifteen deaths. Both the milk and water are reported as entirely satisfactory. Child Hygiene Nurse Theresa Conway reported 111 home visits, seven terminated cases, thirty-five attending keep-well station and thirteen new cases; while Child Hygiene Nurse Anna S. Sibley reported 215 home visits, with 56 on the waiting list; forty-three new cases, 20 terminated, and 106 attending the keep-well station.

### P. S. Awards No-Accident Bonus Prizes to Operators

A parade of fourteen buses containing trillies and bus operators marked the ceremonies Monday in connection with the awarding of no-accident bonus prizes by Public Service Railway and Public Service Transportation companies to operators in the Essex Division. The parade was from Lincoln Park to Public Service Terminal Newark, where more than 800 operators gathered in the auditorium to receive their checks. The night operators received their bonuses in the morning and the day operators in the evening.

The No-Accident Bonus Plan, put into effect last December, provided \$1 a week for each week in the year in which the operator had no accident. In all the divisions throughout the State \$120,000 was distributed. In the Essex Division approximately \$12,000 was awarded to 1,330 men.

### ANCIENT ELEPHANT FOUND IN NEBRASKA

Giant Tusk Built on Lines of Steam Shovel.

Omaha, Neb.—They've found a new elephant on here in Nebraska. Dr. Henry Fairfield Osborn, famous paleontologist of New York, says it's a real discovery and that nothing like it has ever been found before.

The new elephant is built along the lines of a steam shovel. Its great tusk extend straight out in front and the ends are shaped just like a shovel. These tusks extend from the lower jaw and from the side. They measure seven feet. The length of the lower jawbone of the largest mammoth elephants heretofore known is less than two feet.

Dr. H. F. Osborn, head of the paleontological department of the University of Nebraska, and curator of the university museum, says the animal walked the earth some 1,000,000 or 2,000,000 years ago.

This particular type of elephant, which has been named "Amelodon Fieldi" used to roam the Nebraska plains. The individual skeleton has just been found in Frontier county, this state, and is now in the museum of the University of Nebraska. Only the lower jaw, the huge tusks, tremendous teeth, still in place in the jaw bone, a rib and a toe bone have been found, but the expedition from the University of Nebraska is now searching Frontier county for other traces of the big fellow who carried a spade like a steam shovel out in front of him as he walked.

The ends of the two tusks are set very close together, making practically a broad, straight continuance line across the end where the "spade" comes in contact with the earth. The huge molars measure nine inches long and are still firmly set in the jawbone. These molars are in perfect condition, and the tusks have the density and other marks of true ivory. The specimen is perfect. It will be mounted in the earth museum of the University of Nebraska.

The gigantic combination of steam shovel and natural jaw discovered in the Nebraska prairie and turned the "spade" over into a "hoe" as it were, and the "spade" is no longer a "spade" but a "hoe" as it were. In the days that the big fellow roamed the earth Nebraska was either the shores of an ocean or was a great inland sea. The "steam shovel" was in use to turn the soil up food such as seaweed from beneath the waters, or for excavating in mud or loose earth and send it in search for food.

### Mystery About Tusks

The end of the jawbone proper into which the heavy tusks are set is a comparatively light bone, seeming not nearly strong enough to stand the heavy strain which might be supposed to have been exerted on the heavy designs of which the shovel tusks would be capable. This peculiarity makes something of a mystery out of the use of the tusks. Doctor Barbour hazards the guess that as the great mammoth dug, he wrapped his trunk around the "shovel" in the heaviest part and that this took most of the strain off the jawbone.

"The shovel-mammoth," says Doctor Barbour, "must have carried his head high in order that the protruding mandible could clear the ground when it walked, and not interfere with progression. Fortunately our specimen is perfect. The tusks have the whiteness and the density, as well as the decorative lines of ivory. The bones are white and firm and the molars almost unblemished."

The shovels extend from the lower jawbone in this elephant, while in other elephants the tusks extend from the upper jaw. Doctor Barbour makes a guess that the upper tusks may have been discarded or possibly absorbed altogether in this new mammoth.

First indications of the presence of the fossil remains of the big "shovel" tusks were reported to the university by A. S. Keith of Freedom, Frontier county, and a geological expedition was sent to that county to search for other remains. It was this expedition that gathered the lower jaw, the tusk and molars, the rib and the toe bone. It is hoped that additional remains will eventually be found of the "steam shovel" elephant.

## Don't Burn Up House and Friends for Christmas Day

Fire Chief Ritzman Warns Against Perils of Holiday Customs, Trees, Etc.

With their matches and making materials while near trees and decorations. Keep matches out of reach of small children.

"Toys requiring alcohol, gasoline or kerosene should be avoided as much as possible," says Fire Chief Walter H. Ritzman, in a preliminary warning against fire hazards.

The old gentleman should keep away from open fires and lights. As an additional precaution his costume should be made of non-flammable material. If he must wear a flammable costume, it should be made of a material that is not easily ignited and should be kept away from the fire.

Holiday fires are almost always due to carelessness, the chief of the department says. According to figures compiled by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, about one in every ten Christmas fires results in loss of life.

"Certainly nobody wants anything like that to happen to him," says Ritzman. "I feel that they will be the trick if householders will pay attention to them. Here they are."

If you must have a candle in the window, Christmas Eve, use an electric candle. The use of candles is not safe. If a Christmas tree is used, be sure that it is securely set up; don't give it a chance to topple over, and keep the tree away from heating and lighting fixtures.

Use metal tinsel, fake asbestos and powdered mica in place of the highly dangerous, flammable tinsel and cotton.

"Do not illuminate a Christmas tree with candles. Colored electric lights are more ornamental, and if used with care, are safe. A spotlight focused on the tree is the safest method of all."
