

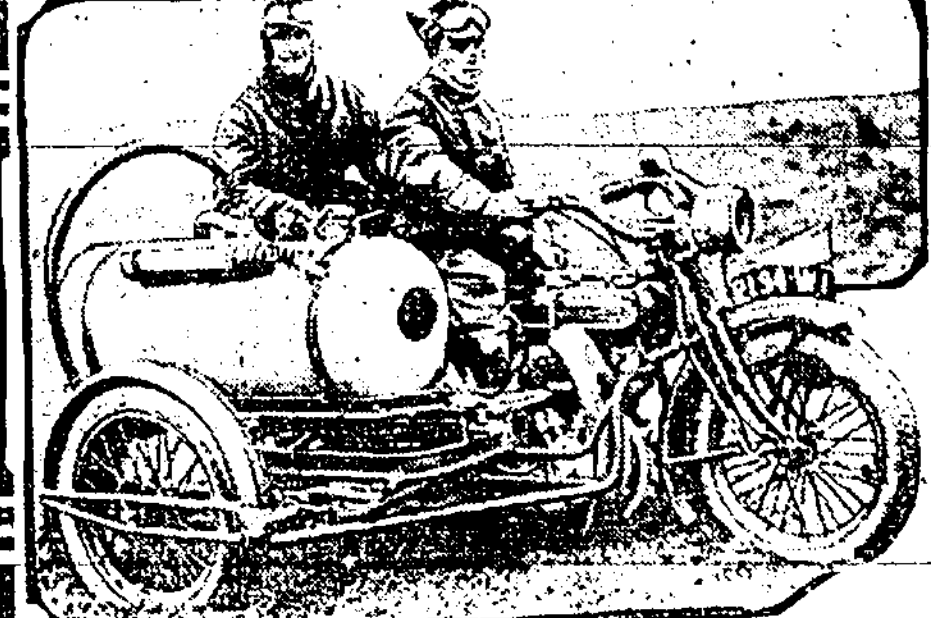


COUNTY REGISTER HAS BIG RECEIPTS

Receipts of the office of County Register for 1927 totaled \$202,262.84, a record amount, according to a statement issued today by Deputy William L. Helmslander. The register's office returned a profit to the county of \$52,922.70 for 1927, bringing the total profits produced by the office for the past ten years to \$231,218.55.

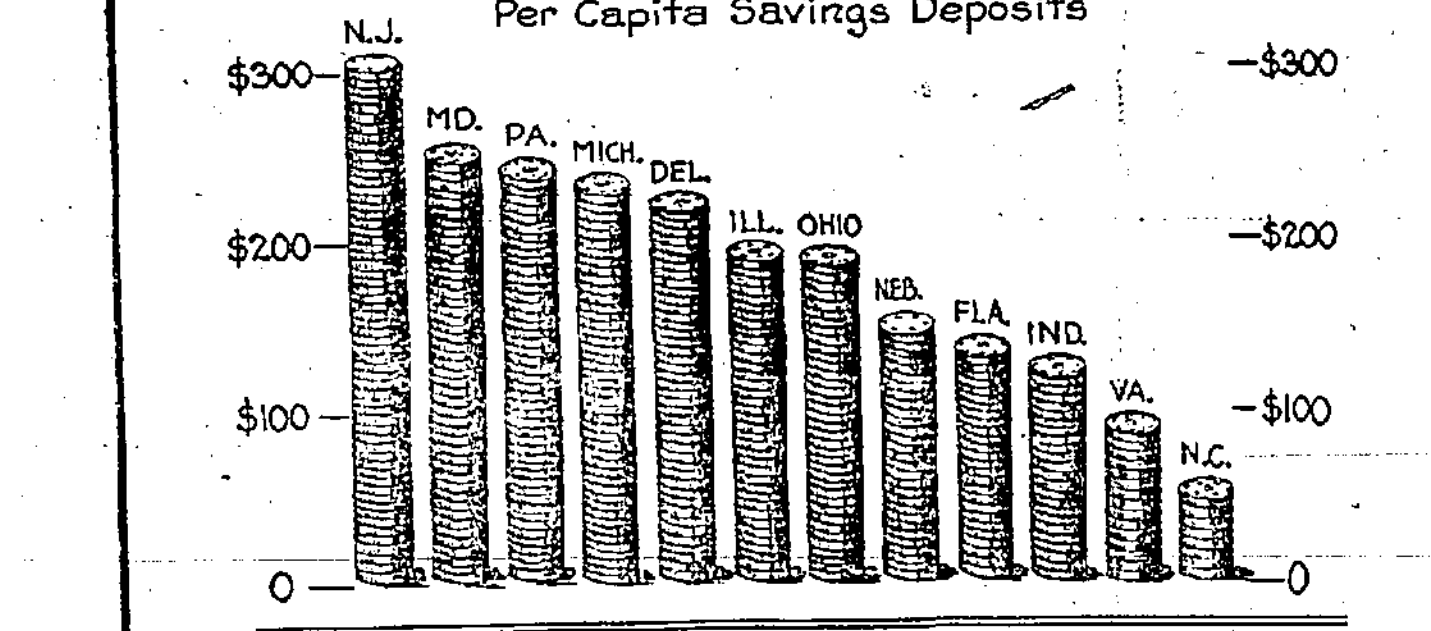
