Notice is hereby given that there will be a Special Meeting of the Common Council Tuesday Night, October 9, at 8 o'clock, to discuss the proposed widening of Main Street.

It is proposed to widen Main Street 3 feet on each side from the Pennsylvania Railroad to Milton Avenue, at an approximate cost of \$12,000.

Removal of the telephone office of the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company from 112 East Main Street to its present address in Rahway.


