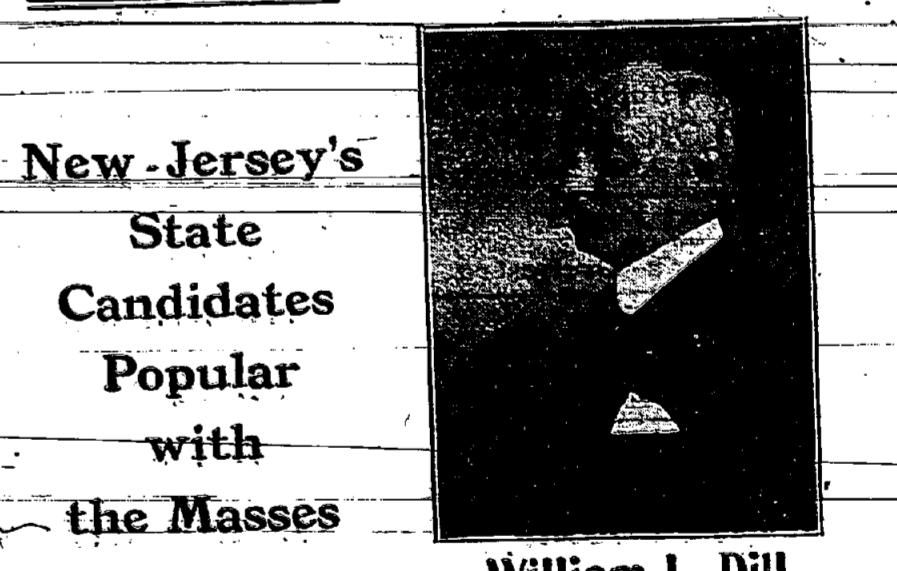

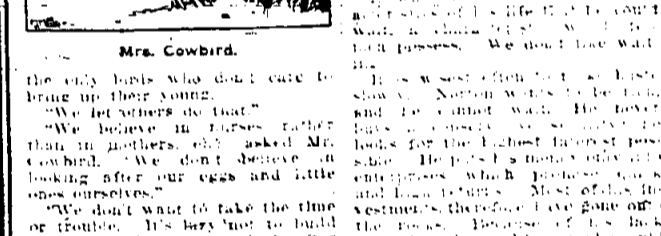

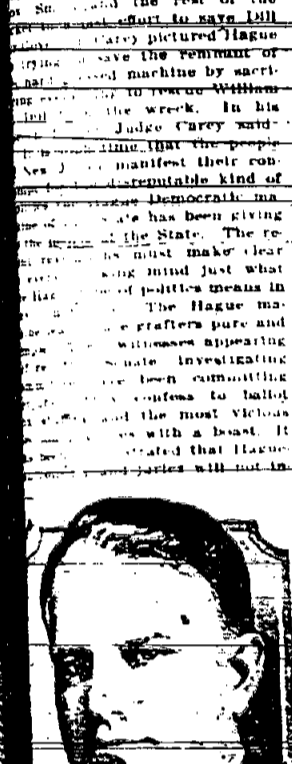

# INVESTIGATE TAX PAYERS INCOMPETENCE

If the present extravagant management of our City's business is to be continued, how long will it be before we are again a bankrupt City as in the year of 1880 or thereabouts.

Bonds given in compromising that indebtedness, are still outstanding and each year-the tax-payers-are continuing to pay.

The Republicans in power, appropriated at the beginning of the year, \$45,634.13 more than in 1927, Let us see what they did with the money.

Do you recall that the first thing they did was to buy automobiles? They bought one for almost everybody in the City Hall except the Overseer of the Poor.

Perhaps that was not so much from a desire to save the cost of ONE automobile as it was a proper regard for and respect to the feelings of the poor. Think of the City Overseer of the Poor driving up to the door of a dependent in a "Limousine" when his whole duty was to hand out \$2.50 or \$3.00 and, not that unless he saw that the 'poor one' was living within the City's allowance.

They refused an offer made by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of this County, to pay approximately one fifth of putting a sewer down in North Oliver Street. First, they passed an ordinance to have the City at large pay the entire cost but, when the Mayor vetoed it they passed another ordinance to make it an assessment proposition. But they never accepted the offer of the Board of Freeholders to pay a considerable part of the cost. Was that good business?

The appropriation for current expenses in 1928, was forty-five thousand six hundred and thirty-four dollars and thirteen cents more than in 1927. Forty-five thousand six hundred and thirty-four dollars and thirteen cents! Interest on eight hundred thousand. Fifty thousand dollars spent for an incinerating plant with the cost of collecting garbage not decreased rather increased. The burning of garbage was a nuisance to residents in that section. It could have been removed to a remote section of our city and this extravagant outlay saved at least until the City arrived at a position where we could better afford it.

We have two traffic signal lights-one on the Highway and Grand Street and another on the Highway and Central Avenue. The cost of operating these two stations is over \$12,000 a year because it means the salary of two full time Policemen and the salary of three part time men. Five men to run them! This twelve thousand dollars per year is interest on two hundred and forty thousand dollars.

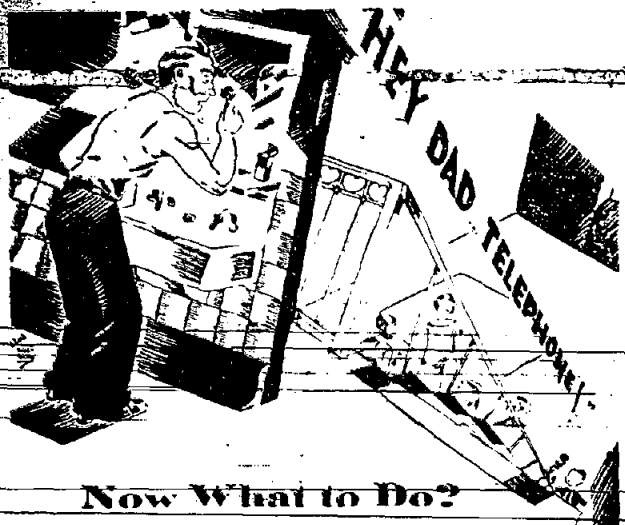
