The false blossom disease, which threatens to wipe out New Jersey's extensive cranberry-growing in-The false blossom disease, which threatens to wipe out New Jersey's extensive cramberry-growing in-dustry, is spread by an insect known as the blunt-nosed leafhopper, scientists of the State Agricultural Experiment Station have found. The disease, although incuraive, can be prevented by destroying the leaf-hopper, control measures for which have been worked out by the Experiment Station. Shown above are: (1) Charles S. Beckwith, the station's cramberry authority, who proved the guilt of the leafhopper; (2) blunt-nosed leafhoppers; (3) specimen of cramberry vine infected with false-blossom; and (4) growers spraying as directed by the Experiment Station to kill leafhoppers.
