Mr. and Mrs. Edward K. Cone, Colonia, accompanied by their children, the Misses Helen and Kathleen Cone, have returned from an interesting six weeks' trip to Norway, Sweden and Russia.

Reviewing his observations of conditions in Russia to a reporter for "The Record" during an interview, Mr. Cone stated that Dictator Joseph Stalin and his political stooges had practically eliminated the brain power of the country and had consigned its present dictators to persons of inferior mental capacity.

He spoke enthusiastically of the ultimate success of Russia's famous "Five-Year Plan" and declared the time will come when the Soviets will raise themselves by the bootstrap from existing unsettled conditions to a forward looking, efficient and business-like nation.

Dictator Stalin already is beginning to show signs of gradually breaking away from trenchant Communist policies, according to Mr. Cone. This is evident in Stalin's decision to pay workers on a sliding scale in accordance with what they are able to produce.

Mr. Cone said that a maximum sum is fixed so that peasants or factory workers, particularly the latter, are unable to increase their earnings beyond a certain amount. Everything is state-owned in Russia, Mr. Cone said, and the peasants, some of whom are as free as the wind, are operated by the government. As to the "goose" well, Mr. Cone pointed out, "they do feel a broom occasionally."

Mr. Cone said he confidently expected Russia would emerge from its present chaotic and chaotic state into a republic, and that the dictatorial form of rule would be abolished.
