Caring For Indigents

SOMEONE has said that like taxes, the poor are always with us. This condition is true n eras of prosperity as well as in times of charges, which through no fault of their own have no one to look after them and they must rely on neighbors and the city for a home. This condition has been partially taken care of by the state through the passage at the last session of the Legislature of the State Pension Act. But this act only affects those persons over 70 years of age and is the caring for indigents between 50 and

At the present time there are two men and two women in the Memorial Hospital receiving medical aid through the city poor department. There are about a dozen other cases in various parts of the city. One case which has just been investigated by the overseer of the poor is that concerning a woman 87 years old who is a maiden lady and hasn't a single relative in the world. She is being noused and fed through the generosity of a local family and the city. Another case is concerning an elderly lady who has been given \$10 a month by her son who, because of conditions, is now only able to contribute \$6-a month which is not enough to keep her alive. There are many other such cases which are a drain on the poor budget of the city, exclusive of the many requests for aid due to un-

employment. The only solution to this problem, which ncidently would be the most economical, would be for Rahway to have a welfare home for such charges. Years ago there was a poor house here but as the need diminished the project was discontinued. Elizabeth has a Welfare Home which cares for its old and feeble and such a place would be a welcome addition to this community... We have a new home for stray dogs, why not have such a

With only a dozen such charges in Rahwelfare home. It might be possible for local poor authorities-to-interest-the-Board-ofother Uinon County cities could co-operate in a phase of unemployment which has not been ouched here and is one which is of paramount importance as we will always have this type of person to care for.
