demption fees in 1929, and a much smaller. amount in 1930. These figures show that Councilman A. C. Peakes was somewhat lavish in his declaration that nearly \$1,000 is receited annually in dog redemption fees.

As City Clerk William J. Hennessy was never instructed to receive such fees from the dog varden he should, like Hoffman, be exonerated by the public of having knowledge of where the alleged fees went or why collections were not reported by the dog catcher. It will be up to the councilmanic investigating committee to determine who is at fault and to probe into the affairs of the dog warden and endeavor to solve the mystery. One fact was disclosed, however, that no one has taken much interest in what the dog

taicher did except Councilman Feakes, who has fostered the movement for a local dog pound in Rahway. Last year's administration was content to receive a report from Dog Warden Jack Baumgartner whenever the warden seemed disposed to make a report, while this year the only report on his activities has been contained in what reports he has made to the police department. These have been incorporated in the monthly reports of Chief of Police George McIntyre. It is a peculiar state of affairs that no report is demanded of the dog catcher each month. He is paid out of a separate budget prepared by the Common Council and therefore is obliged to report his activities each month directly to the council as is demanded of the police chief, street commissioner, over--seer of the poor, building inspector, etc. According to the ordinance regulating the apprehension and disposal of dogs, the warden is required to work in conjunction with the police autorities and give this department a summary of his activities as well as the council.
