





stand out as Christians, with whom the world may differ, but to whom it cannot be indifferent. Today it is difficult to tell from the conversation and attitude of a man whether he is a Church member or simply a morally earnest non-Christian. Both in the pulpit and in the new such moral earnestness, or even sentimenhumanitarianism, too often pass for Christianity.

It is a decadent Christianity which allows such a state of affairs. I read a sermon a few months ago which was entitled, "Christ the Divider of Men." That is a rather startling thought for an age which glibly talks of the love of Christ and of the many pathways to God. But Jesus said, "Think ye that I am come to bring peace to the earth? I tell you, Nay, but rather division." No one was more loving, more tolerant, more symetic, more gentle than Jesus. He healed the sick, brought isht and comfort to the poor, filled the despairing with hope. self and to the spreading of the message which He had come to bring. "If any man cometh unto me, and hateth not his own father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own-life also, he cannot be my disciple." A willingness to put Christ before even the opinions of our family and friends, to say nothing of our own likes and dislikes, is a consists of discipleship. The early disciples faced just that, but they stood for something; there was no danger of confusing them with the pagan world of their day, or even with the leaders of formal religion. They stood out from their generation. "Ye

are not of this world." Jesus told them. But it seems to me that we modern Christians are anxiously attempting to avert all possible clash with the world round about us instead of standing out in bold relief against the current background of vitlated spiritual convictions and low moral standards. Frankly and plainly, I believe the reason to be unwillingness on our part as a body, to face the criticism, the silent contempt, the social and, yes, even the religious estracism which inevitably ollow on a decision to live out the Christian message to the hilt. We don't dare be different. But the only thing that is going to save this modern age from complete spiritual and moral bankruptcy is a group of people who do dare be different; who are onvinced that it is sin which has gotten the world into the present mess, and that Jesus Christ has the answer for it; who are willing to do anything and to be called anything so that they
