

It is the Self within us that defies our resolutions and wrecks our hopes. The "good news" of the message of Christ is that this Self

can be changed. We cannot accomplish by resolve. Christ bringsabout by revolution. But first we must surrender this thing in us that objects to being aided from the outside, this pride of self-sufficiency, and lose our prejudice against His principle of life. Our generation says, "Self-expression"; He says "Selfdenial." Our friends say, "Find yourself"; He says, "Lose yourself." The World says, "Improve yourself"; He says, "You must be born again." We must decide whose advice we are going to follow.
