

Elizabeth, Oct. 20—Joseph Bucher, 40, retired business man, was found dead last night in a garage in the rear of his home at 627 Fulton street. He was inside his car and the garage, which was closed, and filled with carbon monoxide gas. County Physician C. A. Brokaw declared it was suicide. Three days ago Bucher took his wife to New York to visit relatives. He was not seen alive again.
