Enlarging The Child's Vocabulary Should Be Duty Of All Parents

By the late Edith D. Brown, Former Extension Service Child Training Specialist.

Many adults are handicapped by a vocabulary too limited in scope to express their ideas. Often it is because in a commonplace address given at St. Lawrence University, several times other things the importance of enlarging a discriminating vocabulary.

"Language is the principal conveyor of understanding and so we must learn to use it not crudely but discriminately," said the speaker.

Since speech is learned, not inherited, and since the language learned best is the language of the child, it is obvious that the speech habits which the child learns from contact with his own family are the habits that stick. When we consider a child's vocabulary, we mean, of course, selecting the best words to express the particular idea.

There are a few things that parents may do even with a young child to start him on the road to greater power in the use of his mother tongue. First, the child should become familiar with the use and meaning of a word, substitute a different word for a similar meaning. 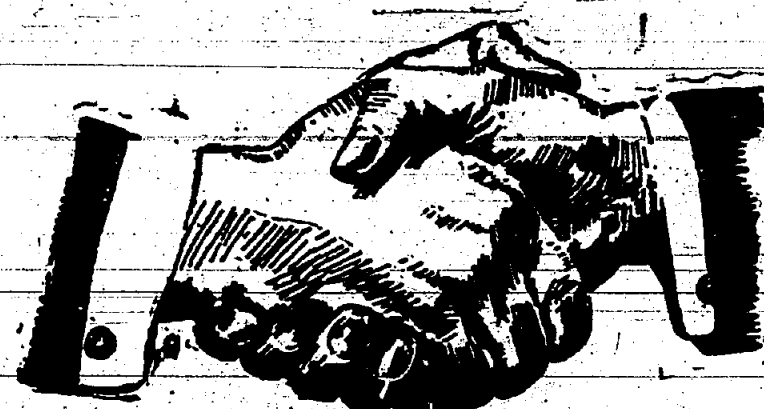

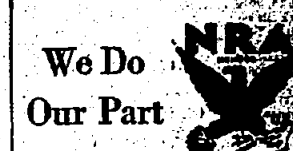
