The Home Garden

Now that winter has started it is time to protect your outdoor plants. Keep the garden in a dormant stage for the rest of the year.

Newark police have already filed detainers for the trio to appear in court on charges of disorderly conduct and resisting arrest.

The trio was captured by Patrolman John Klecker, assisted by Patrolman C. J. Crowley and Joseph J. Ryan, and taken to the Newark Police Department.
