4,197,600 Seconds Spent Each Evening On Home Work By R. H. S. Pupils

to be of wide interest. Editor. An approximate total of 1,116 hours spent by

Rahway high school students in one night's Rahway high school students in one hights homework assignments has been revealed by 583 responses to Question Nine of the recent Journalism club questionnaire.

This figure was calculated in the following hamer. An average of one-half hour is spent on an average of four major subjects by each of the 583 students, resulting in the fotal of 1,116 hours, or 48 days and 14 hours, or 50 680 minutes or 4 197 500 seconds.

69,060 minutes, or 4,197,600 seconds. In a school week, 242 days and 22 hours. or approximately eight months, two-thirds of a year, is consumed.

In a month of 21 school days these same students plow through 34 months or almost three years' time in studying. It is therefore assumed that during one school year, about 30 -years' total time is spent by the entire school

body doing homework.

If all the minutes spent by students in solving equations, memorizing irregular French verbs, balancing chemistry equations, grinding out compositions, digesting geometry theorems, learning historical dates and remembering the Latin conjugations, the total aggregates 90 years, is is figured.

Members of the MBABC pubically announced that after last Thursday night police ing liquor without permission of the board, If there are any such places left in Rahway, it must be the next act of the MBABC to close them up at once. If they aren't closed, all is lost so far as the MBABC is concerned. There are always those persons who will take advantage of others when possible or will try to "get away with something." If persons of this type have chosen to sell liquor without licenses and are not stopped immediately, the citizens' beverage license board will become a laughing stock, and from then on their work will be useless.

In order to make certain that the order for unlicensed liquor stores to close is obeyed immediately, the MBABC should order an immediate canvass, by authorized and honest persons, of the entire city. Anyone disobeying the liquor orders should be closed without ceremony. In order to do this properly, members of the MBABC must have the complete co-operation of every city offical and very right-thinking citizen.

Thus far Rahway's liquor board has done its work well. Closing of unlicensed sales places is the next job, and one which the board is well qualified to do; one also which they ar e authorized and duty bound to do.







1.School Commission Urges Savings In Janitorial Costs

Trenton. Dec. 22 The schools of New Jersey can eve at least \$2,000,000 through economies in plant operation, janitorial service and other costs, states a supplementary report made today to Governor Moore by the New Jersey School Survey Commission.

The Commission, headed by Thomas N. McCarer, as chairman, has been conducting a survey under the direction of Dr. Paul F. Mort, director of the

The costs of operating the physical school plant in New Jersey is approximately \$9,000,000 of which 25,000,000 is appropriated to janitorial, engineering employees, the commission reports. It points out that the total operation of the physical plants of the day schools is 10.5 percent of the current expenses while the pay of janitorial employees is 6.5 percent of current expenses. The report adds: "If present salary schedules are maintained and
