Pascoe Bill Before Assembly Would Change Election Laws

(By Special Writer From Universal Service)

Trenton, Jan. 16.—A bill by Herbert Pascoe, Republican of Union county, to amend the election law, was before the state assembly. The measure provides for the holding of primary elections in September instead of May.

Agree To Two Percent Sales Tax

Trenton, Jan. 16.—The Republican joint conference committee of the Legislature has agreed to the introduction of a two-percent retail sales tax bill by which it is estimated approximately \$35,000,000 will be raised for the relief of schools.

Senator William H. Albright, Gloucester county, Republican majority leader, said the bill will be prepared in time for introduction next Monday or Tuesday. In the meantime, a public hearing is to be held some time this week, he said.

Albright also disclosed the plan calling for the state to assume some of the cost of courts and other county positions which are regarded as really state functions.

Senate Gets Appointment

Trenton, Jan. 16.—Governor Moore last night sent to the Senate 11 nominations with the provision he was willing to meet the Republican threat of trading by sending only Democratic appointments.

Among the appointments was that of Edward L. Whelan, Elizabeth, as clerk of the Chancery court. John H. Toohy, Jersey City, the governor's secretary, was nominated for the \$15,000 labor commissioner's position, succeeding Charles R. Blunt.

Civil Service Demonstration

Trenton, Jan. 16.—More than 5,000 veterans and members of the State Civil Service association stormed the state house last night in one of the greatest demonstrations ever seen here to protest to the Legislature against amendment of the proposed Raper bill suspending civil service in the highway department.

Upholds R. R. Tax Laws

Trenton, Jan. 16.—Dr. Harley Lutz, Princeton, today reported to the legislative commission on revision of railroad tax laws, that in his opinion New Jersey's present laws can be successfully administered if the state is given authority to fix valuations. Assessments at the present are determined by local assessors and it is on their figures that the average rate by which the railroads are taxed is fixed.

Would Abolish Excise Boards

Trenton, Jan. 16.—Abolition of municipal excise boards, the granting to the state commissioner the right to approve conditions imposed by municipalities on local licenses, and creation of a separate state appeals board to pass upon the law, were urged last night by D. Frederick Burnett, alcoholic beverage commissioner, in a report to the legislature.

Congress Plans Action On Gold

Washington, Jan. 16.—Congress today prepared to act promptly to make effective President Roosevelt's proposed revaluation of the American dollar at between 60 and 65 cents of its present value, by carrying out his recommendations to nationalize all gold and establish a two-billion dollar stabilization fund in the treasury.

Despite a flare up of opposition, it was believed certain that Congressional approval to reform the American monetary system and place absolute control in the hands of the federal government will be granted. Two administration bills to carry out the president's recommendation will be considered today.

Demanding open hearings and full consideration, Senate Republican Leader McNary called a party caucus for today to decide on plans. But even in opposition ranks, it was conceded the president would have sufficient support to put over his program.

Seizure of title to gold held by federal reserve banks and establishment of the stabilization fund are preliminary to revaluation, the time of which the president left indefinite in his special message to Congress yesterday. It is expected to follow shortly after Congress adjourns.

The new policies were designed to end uncertainty, re-assure American business and restore higher commodity prices.
