Tax Payments Near Million

Adams Received \$997,627 In Taxes In 1935, Records Show

Tax payments here last year reached the total of \$997,627, according to Receiver Robert H. Adams. The increase is due largely to improved financial conditions plus activity of the Tax Lien Committee headed by John H. Magat.

The committee solved a number of problems by arranging for installment payments and in this manner cleared up many delinquencies from other years. The bulk of the near-million dollar payment in 1935 was composed of 1935 and 1934 assessments. The percentage of payment on the 1935 levy has not yet been computed but it is expected it will exceed the percentage of 1934 when 65 percent of the levy was paid by December 31.

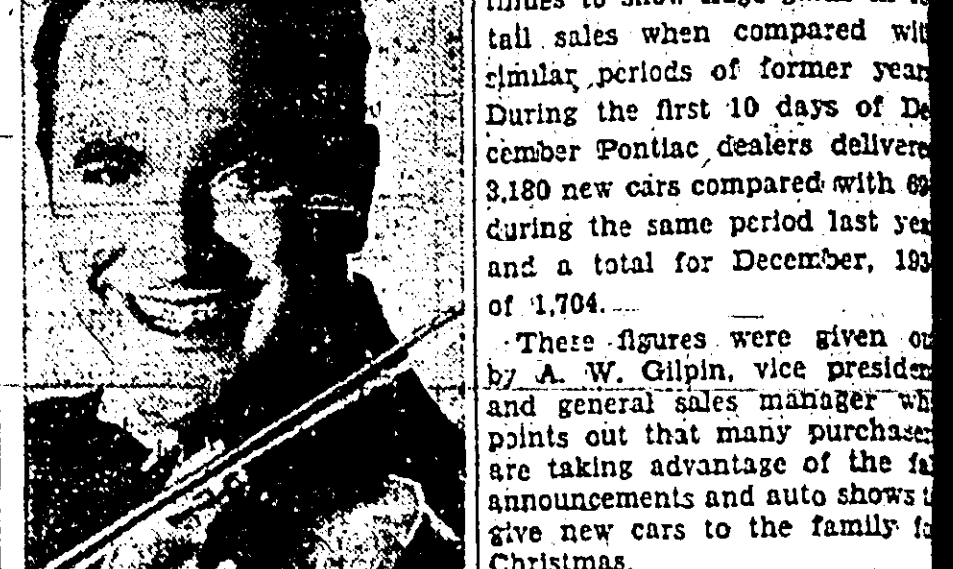
