## 100 Accidents Caused In City In Six Months

### Fiscal Year Ends With 57 Persons Hurt In Auto Crashes In Rahway

### More In June Than In Any Other Month

An even 100 automobile accidents were caused in the city during the first half of 1936, according to the statistics compiled by The Record from police reports.

The end of June brought the number of persons injured during the first six months to 57. One person was killed and 102 cars or trucks were involved in the mishaps.

**34 JUNE MISDEEDS**

June is a busy month. Accidents caused here in any previous month and a total of 34 mishaps were reported to police during the 30 days of the month. In fact, the city's motor vehicle accidents in 1936 are more than double the total for any other month of the year.

Contrary to the belief that the majority of city accidents are caused by out-of-town drivers is the fact that in the 24 June mishaps, 19 were drivers who lived here. There were six trucks and 38 passenger cars involved in the June accidents.

## DRINK CAUSES TWO CRASHES

Two drunken drivers, one a Rahwayite and one an out-of-towner, were responsible for automobile crashes during June. Both were committed to the county jail for default of payment of fines and their licenses were taken from them for the mandatory two-year period.

Of the accidents, only six were caused on the two main highways, Route 26 and Route 37. One driver was killed in the crash on Route 26 and another was injured. The crash on Route 37, in which two cars were involved, was the scene of three accidents and driving and driving drunk the leads to two crashes during the month.

## City Gets \$20,525 From 47 Licensed Liquor Operators

### Three Less Than Last Year Are Dispensing Beverages In Rahway

Thirty-three taverns, seven clubs and one cafe received 47 licenses for the year 1936-37. The city received \$20,525 from the operators of these places for the year. Three operators were not licensed because they had not paid the required \$500 fee.

Three who were granted licenses along with those previously approved were Frederick P. Martin, 37 Lafayette street, John Jack, 81-87 Lewis street and Maurice Fox, 72 Main street. Martin and Jack obtained consumption licenses while Fox was awarded a distributor's license.

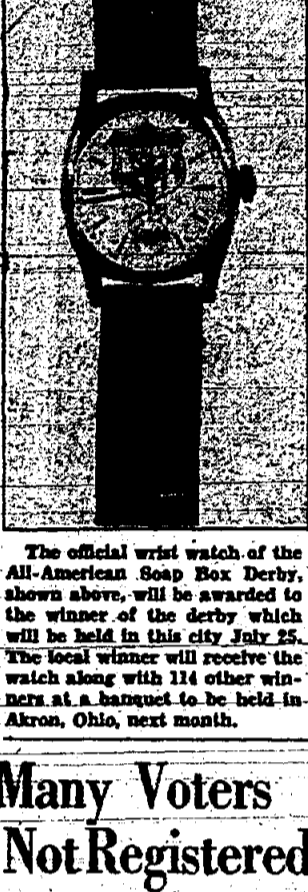

## Current Tax Payments Up During June

### Total Receipts Less Than Last Year. But 1936 Payments Show Rise

Receiver Adams Collects Total of \$39,330 in Month

Although total receipts of Receiver of Taxes Robert H. A. Adams were slightly less last month than they were in June a year ago, the figures reveal that taxpayers paid more current taxes last June than they did for the same month in 1935.

Adams received a total of \$39,330 from all tax sources during the past month while in June 1935 the total amount taken in by his office aggregated \$41,683.23.

Current tax payments last month were \$11,859.09, or 29.2 percent of total receipts, as against \$9,571.45 in current payments a year ago.

## Many Voters Not Registered

### Nearly 2,000 Eligibles Who Voted In 1932 Have Not Yet Been Listed

There are 1,200 less Rahway voters eligible for the November election than there were in the last Presidential election in 1932, according to the tabulation of the County Board of Elections. This decrease is because of the fact that since Rahway last voted in a Presidential election, permanent registration has been inaugurated here.

## Start Circulation Of Plunkett Civil Service Petition; See Fall Vote

A healthy increase in the amount of building construction was noted here during the past month. In comparison with the same month a year ago, Building Inspector Pellegrino reports, Rahway issued 18 permits authorizing construction valued at \$24,000 during June this year while for the same month a year ago he issued 21 permits for work valued at only \$2,355.

Of chief importance in the work done during June on six new homes. This is the greatest number of dwellings begun here in any single month in a number of years. The last two permits of the month went to the Model Home Land Company which will build two dwellings in Yuman avenue near Franklin avenue at a cost of \$5,500 each. Bauer and Brooks are agents. Permits for other dwellings during the month went to the Lakeside Park Homes Company, Meadow avenue for a \$5,500 home; B. Gordon, Lafayette street, \$4,500; John Knak, Lincoln avenue, \$2,000 and J. Hazaman, Lincoln avenue, \$1,900.

## Expect \$186,300 Grant For City's Sewer System Link

Rahway Would Have To Furnish Remaining 55 Percent Of Cost

A grant of \$186,300 to be applied to the cost of linking the city's internal sewer system with the Rahway Valley Trunk Sewer is expected to be approved by the Board of Health this week. This amount represents 45 percent of the total project cost. The remainder of the cost would have to be borne by the city which would be able to borrow the money from the PWA.

**CODIFICATION OF ORDINANCES PLANNED**

Three lawyers will be assigned to codify the city's ordinances. The project was first submitted under the old PWA plan early last year by City Engineer Levi Price. Alexander Potter, New York, who represents the city in this matter, submitted the project when the new set-up was inaugurated last year.
