



## Trenton Facts

Editor's note: This is another in a series of articles on New Jersey government. By Senator Charles E. Loefer of Trenton. The total cost of caring for these aged persons will be \$6,084,888, of which 50 percent will be met by the Federal government, 25 percent by the state and 25 percent by the counties. The total cost as reported in state and county reports for the year ending June 30, 1935, was \$2,763,094. As a result of legislation enacted this spring, the state will receive approximately \$4,000,000 of assistance from the Federal government, as well as a contribution of one-third of its administrative cost. The result will be that nearly 40,000 will receive aid instead of approximately 28,000 under the former regulations. The cost, as in the case of old age relief, will be slightly less than would be provided had the Federal aid not been received and the former regulations maintained.



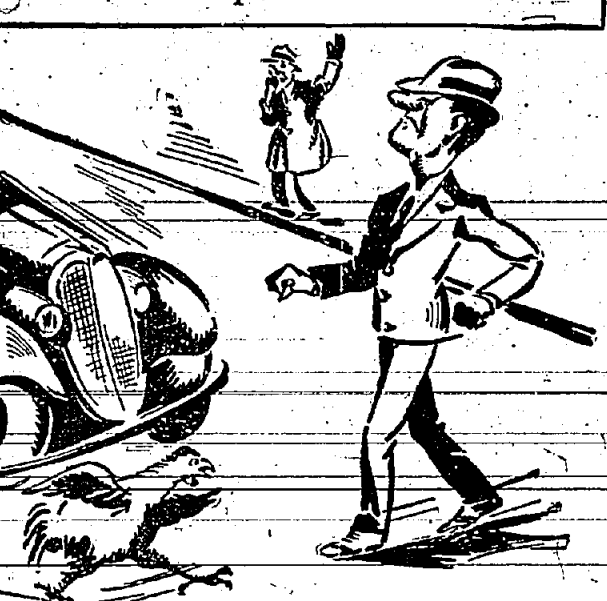

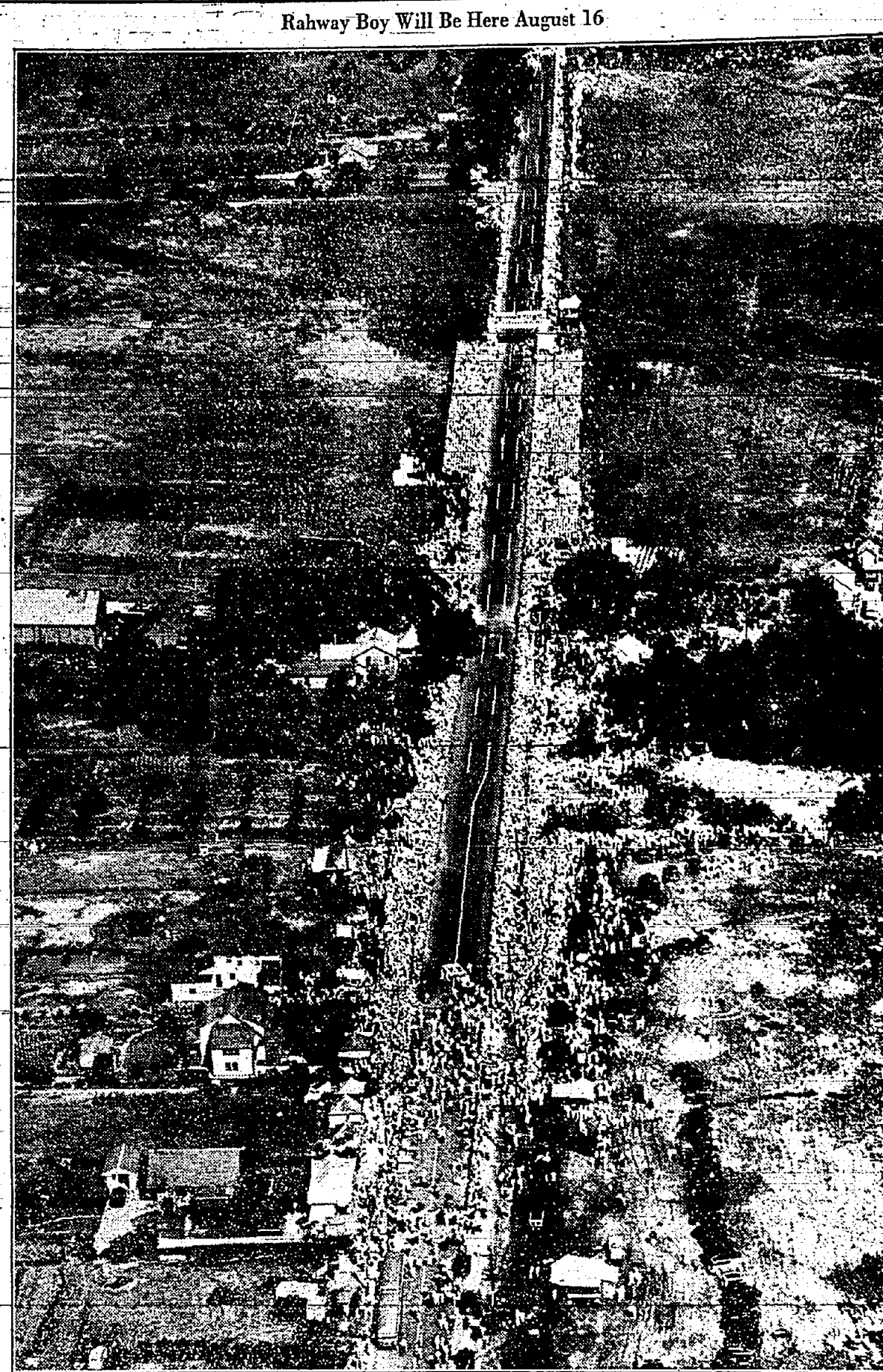

## Maurice Avenue Sewer Project Gets Approval

### Council Finally Passes Ordinance Assuring Relief For Section

Passage of the ordinance assuring the construction of a sewer in Maurice avenue was accomplished by Common Council this week and preparations are being made to start work as soon as the ordinance becomes law.

Construction of this sewer will give relief to owners in the section which has long been a cesspool. The sewer will be laid with the Railway Valley sewer at River road and in section to serving the present homes will also care for needs when the section near Maurice avenue is developed.

Charles Capron March, owner of the property, was present at the public hearing this week. He stated that the sewer was a long time in the making.

Price Makes Comparison. At the request of the City Engineer, H. D. Bensch, Price has made a comparison of the cost of the sewer with the cost of the approved construction another route through his property. The sewer will cost \$147 for construction and \$14.68 for advertising and other expenses—a total of \$161.68.

If the undeveloped area is assessed, as it probably will, the cost to taxpayers in the developed area would be \$1.10 per foot. March would pay \$48 on this basis.

Reed, Flues Back Plan. Using the route through the property and that of the County Park Commission, the cost would be an estimated \$2.25 with March paying \$14.47 for 665.62 feet of his property.

Council has given its approval to the plan, said the City Engineer, H. D. Bensch, speaking for the plan, said it was a plan which would not be a detriment to the city.

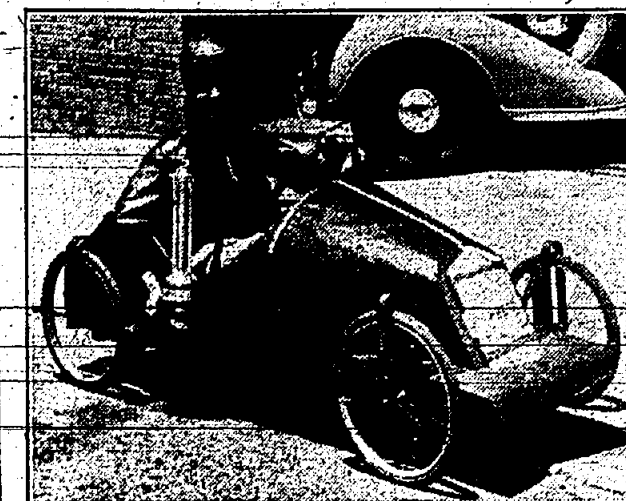
