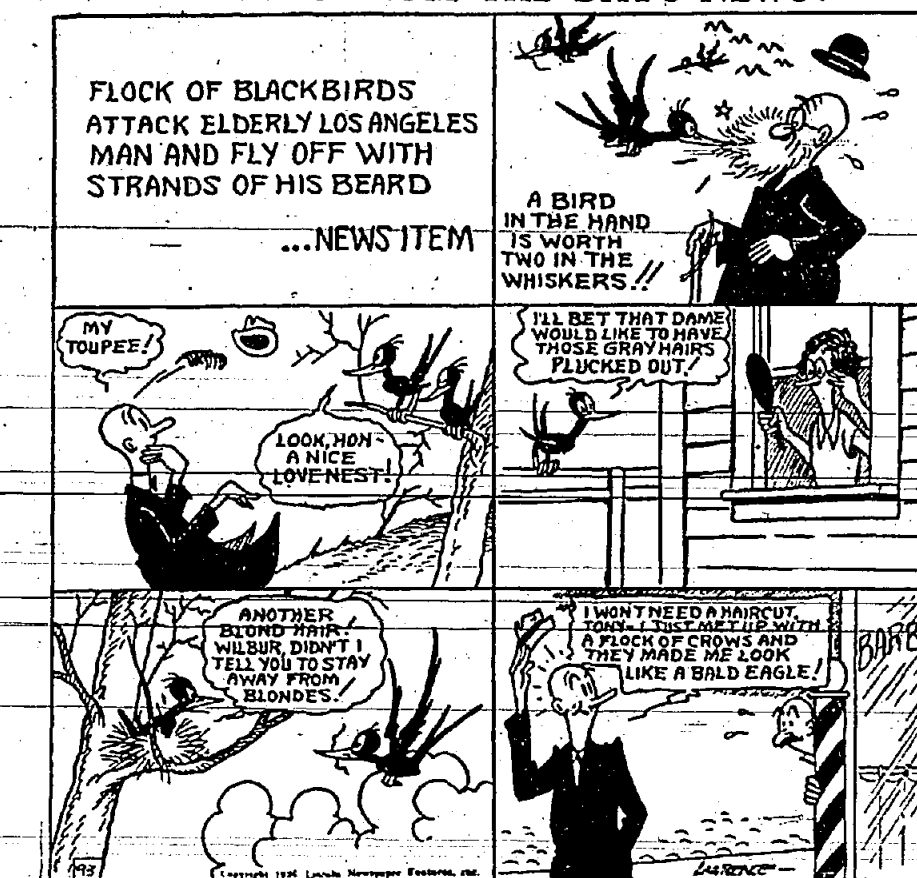
Bus Drivers Now On Same Level As Motorists
Commendation is due Colonel Mark O. Kimberling, formerly Rahway man and now State Police head, for abandoning the system by which members of the State Police formerly "reported" motor vehicle law violations of bus drivers to the bus owners with the belief that the employers would discipline the drivers in the same manner as a police judge.

The Newark Evening News, campaigning and independent publication, recently exposed the existence of the "agreement" which Kimberling inherited when he took over control of the State Police this year. Always known as a fair official, Kimberling lost no time in outlawing the agreement.

Bus drivers are now on the same footing as the average motorist. No longer will it be necessary for police to turn their heads to avoid seeing a violation by a bus driver. There never should have been any leniency shown bus drivers, some of whom have been noted for taking advantage of their positions guiding the huge vehicles.

Motorists will rejoice at the end of the exemption which will be effective if police do their part. In the past, we have urged Rahway police to treat bus drivers the same as any ordinary motorist. Local police have full power over motorists using the streets of the
