We have only to point to a resume of the 1936 school football season to add further weight to our contention that the chief trouble with Railway High School's football fortunes lies in the fact that the club has been badly managed. Nobody would fault putting Sixto Escobar in the same ring with Joe Louis but something similar to that has been happening right here in Railway for the past few years. Thankfully, the Athletic Council has seen the merit of our argument and has begun to lighten the R. H. S. grid schedule.

Railway won two games and lost seven during the past season. Its opponents won a total of 42 games, lost 25 and tied four, a record considerably above the 500 mark. The winning records of opposing teams ranged all the way from the seven wins and one loss of Carver to the low of three wins and five losses of Summit, the worst team on the Scarlet schedule. Even Summit, beaten by Railway for the local's only scholastic win, had a better percentage than the Scarlet and tie and Summit were the only clubs on the local schedule who had marks below the .500 rating for the season. Union was the only other club which nearly fell below an even split and Harry Lake's eleven won and five lost as many.

Looking further at the cold, cruel figures, we find that Railway's school opponents scored an average of 100.6 points each against 43.4 for their opposition. Of course, the fact that Railway failed to score against six opponents helps this record. Railway's opponents totaled 505 points to 247 for their opposition. Railway scored 39 points and allowed the opposition to sift through for 182. This is an average considerably below the Scarlet opponents. Railway averaged 43.4 points per game against 20.2 per game for the opposition. These figures are almost as cold as last week's turkey but they prove that the Scarlet has been badly overmatched. They don't, however, tell of the valiant fight the local youngsters put up against the Poles from Jefferson in that first half. Neither do they tell that next year things should be a bit better when the Scarlet is again playing teams in its own class.

Old Gus Falzer of Hillside, a Newark sports writer who wrote on all-city and all-county teams last Sunday and not a single Railway player was mentioned. How different from the season of 1914, one of the brightest in Railway's history, when Falzer's paper gave eight of the 11 places on the all-Union team to Railway boys. There was Johnny Brooks at left end, "Swatty" Schweitzer at left tackle, Paul Lukens at left guard, Ed Durand at center, Ed Bartlett at right tackle, Fay Rossell at quarterback, Monk Armstrong at left halfback and Doc Armstrong at fullback. Battin and Plainfield won the other three places. We are indebted to the scrapbook of Walter L. Wilson, 1092 Thirteenth place, for the above information. Brooks was named all-state and that year for the second consecutive time while Monk Armstrong was named for the second all-state team. What memories!

We can't let the football season die without recalling the fact that the best example of fight we saw from any Railway High School player in the games was witnessed as displayed by Don Newman, the husky tackle. In the third game especially, when he was up against some big, experienced men Don refused to be mussed up by the big fellows and made some vicious tackles after they had tried to rough him. Don proved an inspiring leader in those games in which he acted as captain. It always does this old guy good to see a youngster show so much spirit in any athletic contest. If Railway High had baseball, Don Newman would easily have established himself as one of the best schoolboy hurlers in the state. Last year a pick-up team of Railway boys played Ted Cooper's strong Linden team and Don, hurrying for the locals, had the Linden boys breaking their necks. Cooper said after the game that he would give anything to have Newman in Linden. Such comment from a coach as great as Cooper is a real compliment and should make local fans realize that Don Newman certainly has something. He is without a doubt the most promising young ball player in action in Railway at the present time.

Rumors of a change in the Rutgers University football coaching staff are bosh, according to a statement received by this department from President Robert C. Grier.
