Naming Of Sewer Inspector Is Important Problem

The question of naming an engineer to represent the city as inspector of construction of the connection of the city's internal sewer system with the Rahway Valley trunk sewer has been extensively discussed by members of Common Council during recent weeks.

Councilman Peakes and several of the Republican members favor naming City Engineer Levi Price, to whose term as a city employee expires December 31, to this job while Democratic colleagues favor naming Harry Edger, who is now in the employ of the city.

Representative of Alexander Potter, consulting engineer representing Rahway on this job, has cited the need of an inspector. Peakes, closely identified with city engineering matters in the past years, claims that Rahway suffered by not having a qualified inspector watching its interest when the trunk sewer was constructed here.

Councilman Reed makes the point that the city effected a saving of about \$40,000 in the estimated cost of the sewer connection through favorable sale of sewer bonds and urges an inspecting engineer so that the present job will be correctly done and will not exceed its estimated cost and thus further hamper chances of reducing municipal debt which must be done to make much-needed school extension possible.

Engineering fees for the sewer have cost the city a pretty penny in the past and we can find little which leads us to believe that the sewer construction is an outstanding piece of work. Council should consider a number of angles. If the efficiency of the work will be threatened by not having a capable engineer represent the city, by all means we should have one.

This must be avoided in the future if we are to salvage some benefit from the costly sewer system which appears to have been a mistake from the start. On the other hand, Council should act cautiously in adding further expense to the project. Only this year the present Council had to cover up mistakes of previous administrations by paying a long-overdue engineering bill of more than \$5,000 which had been in litigation for about five years. Such expenses as these must not be authorized in the future.

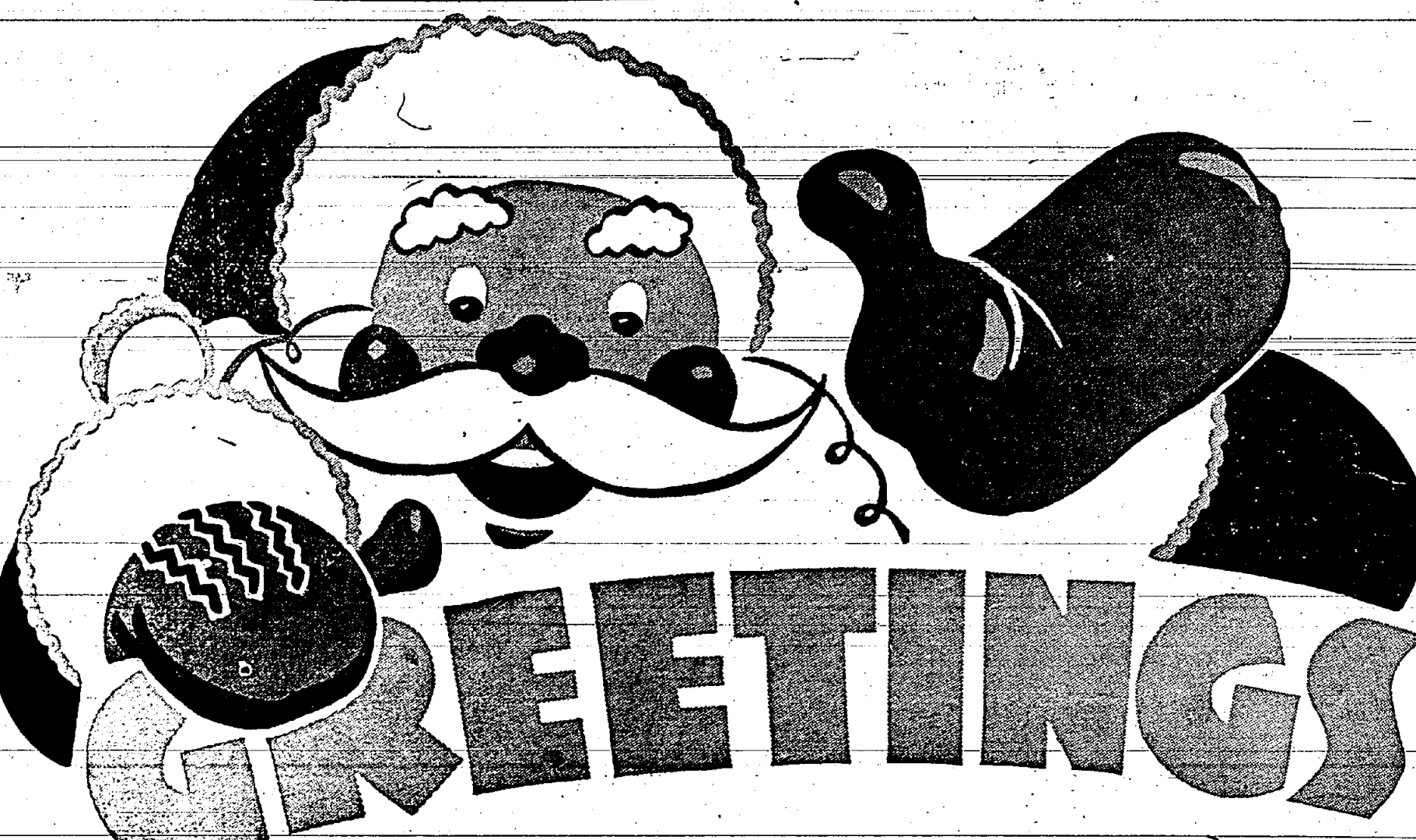

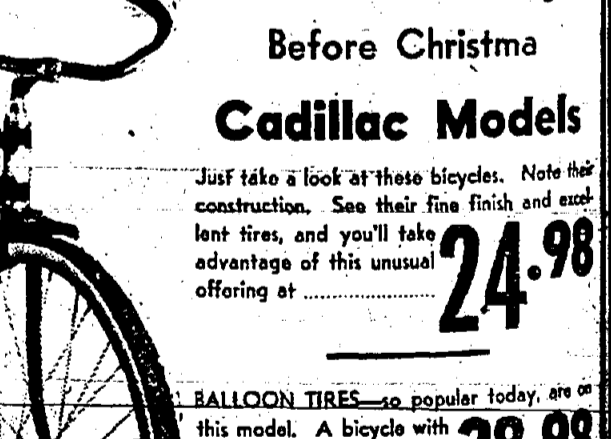

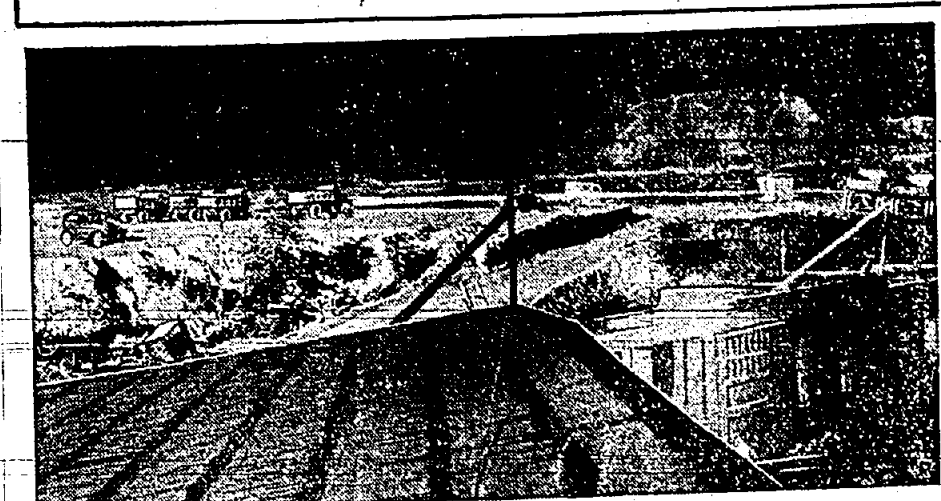

WHITE LIGHTS RUSH FILLING OF SITE FOR NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR OF 1939

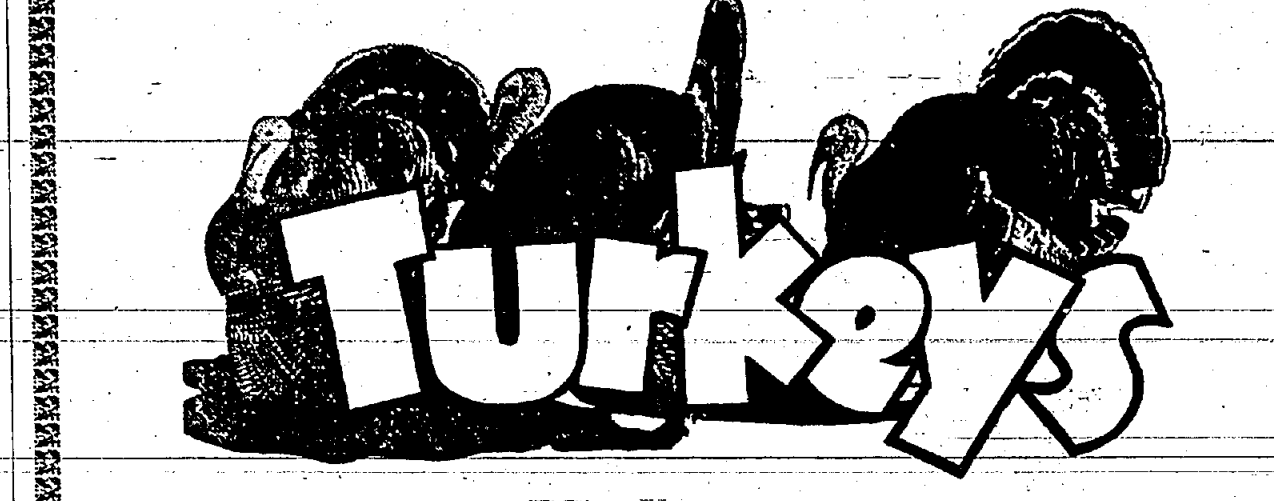
