## Architects Hoping To Finish High School Plans In Two Weeks

Board Members View Preliminary Sketches For Building Accommodating 1,200 Pupils Of Four Grades

Leslie M. Dennis of Elizabeth and Hector J. Feltner of Rahway, school architects, are busy on plans for the proposed new Rahway High School building and hope to have them ready to be submitted to the PWA for a 45 percent grant in about two weeks. The architects showed preliminary sketches to the members of the Board of Education during a meeting at the high school annex this week. The board desires to submit the plans as soon as possible in order to secure the city's receipt of funds now being appropriated in the latest government spending-leaving program.

The plans as sketched this week are not final and may be subject to change. The school building committee chairman, told the board that the present plans call for a separate building with a separate entrance and a separate exit. The building will be a two-story structure and will contain 1,200 pupils of four grades.

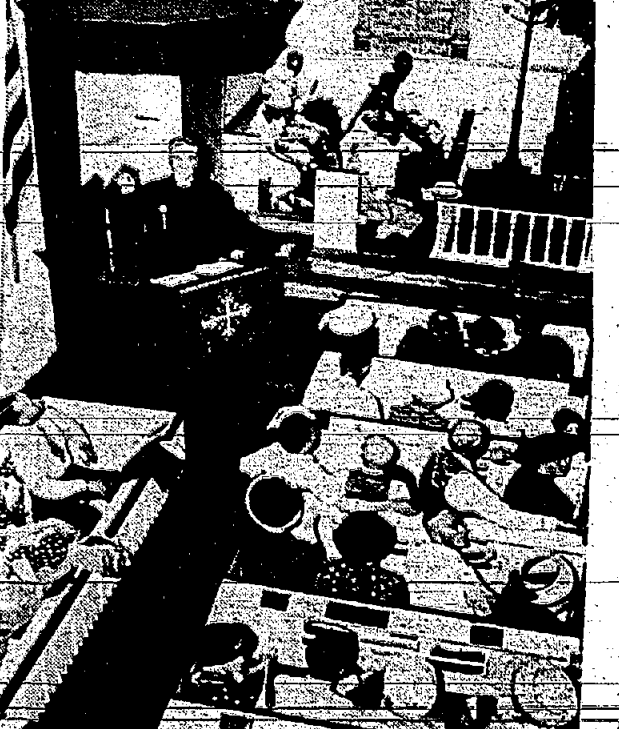

### PART NOW TO INCREASE RAILWAY TAX REVENUE

What to do with property taken over by the city in tax sales during recent years appears to be one of the most important decisions which will face Common Council during the coming months.

Recently the city foreclosed on property valued at between \$50,000 and \$80,000. These parcels were taken over by the city several years previously. Early this year, the Tax Lien Committee started foreclosure proceedings on property assessed at about \$250,000. These proceedings are expected to be completed sometime this year and when they are, the city will find property valued at more than a quarter million dollars in its hands.

This property, unless the titles are transferred to taxpayers, will not produce any revenue. No revenue is being produced now. At the 1938 rate of \$4.17 per \$100 assessed valuation, this property would bring about \$12,500 in taxes to the city each year if taxes were being paid upon it.

The clearance of tax liens and the transfer of property acquired in this manner back into revenue-producing channels has been a municipal problem all over the country since the first depression. However, during the past year there have been taken to make it possible for municipalities to get this property back on the books where it will produce revenue.

During the last session of the Legislature, Senator Hendrickson sponsored legislation authorizing appointment of boards to liquidate tax liens and foreclosed property under direction of the Municipal Finance Commission. It might be well to investigate the provisions of this law by contacting Walter Darby, head of the newly-created commission.

The local Tax Lien Committee, directed by Eugene Miller, has done a good job since its organization during the depression days. A large sum of money has been expended to clear tax liens from properties and as yet no revenue has been produced by them. Although the majority of them won't have clear titles until late this year, now seems to be the time for the Property Management Committee to get to work and decide what method shall be followed in making this property produce revenue.

The entire work of the Tax Lien Committee is going to be wasted along with the money which it has spent unless something is done with this property when the titles are cleared. The Property Management Committee is a new municipal unit but its work promises to be the most important of any Council committee during the next year or two.

It will be unfair to those who pay their taxes if the machinery to make this tax lien property revenue producing is not set up now so that it can operate just as soon as clear titles are obtained. This property has not produced revenue for a number of years and a number of tenants are occupying it without payment of rent. This is unjust to the many Railways who must pay rent. It is unfair to those who pay their taxes regularly and thus enable the city to meet its obligations.

Already offers are being made for property the city has acquired. Perhaps there will be a change to sell some of the property for industrial sites and thus bring another source of revenue to the city.

It is hoped that action may be taken to create a set-up which will enable the city to access at least some of this property in October when the assessments for the coming year are made. The machinery to be set up should not be too expensive. If the city has to create an expensive agency proposition to administer this property, there won't be much left to go into the tax fund.

If possible, this task of disposing of this property or putting it should be administered by the city. Just what should be followed is the decision of the Property Management Committee which is faced with an excellent opportunity to do a valuable piece of work by starting immediately to prepare for liquidation of this tax lien property.

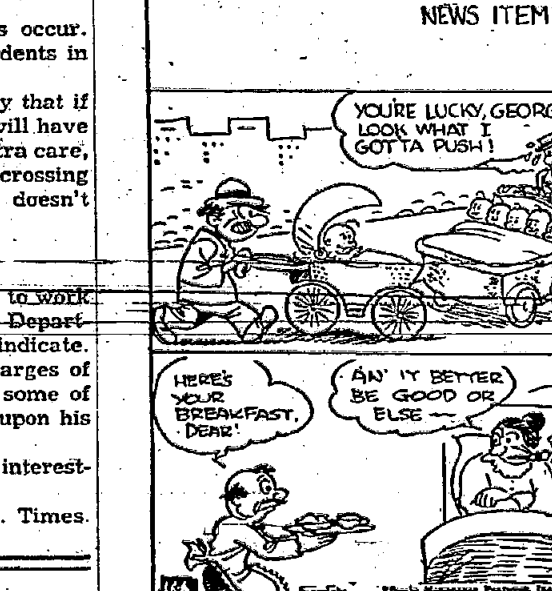
