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

RUBBER URGENTLY NEEDED

Regardless of the completeness of the organization of the service stations in the drive to collect scrap rubber, the success of the campaign in Rahway rises or falls on the response of the residents of the city in bringing in their discarded rubber articles which have been reclaimed from attics, cellars, backyards, garages or anywhere else where bits both large and small, may be found. Old tires, tubes, garden hose, hot water bottles, rubber gloves, tennis shoes, raincoats, bathing cap, in fact anything made of or containing rubber is needed.

While there has been no definite quota set for the city in the scrap rubber drive for the sixteen day period lasting to the end of the month it is up to the residents of Rahway to dig up every scrap of rubber that can be found and take it to the nearest service station. This scrap rubber can be either donated, giving the proceeds to some worthy charity, or it can be sold at the current rate of one cent per pound. However, the main objective is to get the scrap rubber into the hands of the government for its war needs.

Rubber is sorely needed by Uncle Sam for his successful prosecution of the war program. It offers an opportunity to each and every citizen to help the war effort. With the war, a few ounces of rubber in a hot water bottle, or a few pounds of rubber in an old tire may not seem much, but multiply those by millions and a great supply of rubber is available. The city of Rahway is one of the city-very-man-and-child, will respond quickly with contributions of rubber and when June 30th rolls around Rahway will be proud of its efforts to supply more than its share of rubber that is so vitally needed.

ADDITIONAL HOUSING

The conversion of vacant stores into temporary housing units is a possibility that owners of such property have in Rahway may well investigate, and that should be explored quite thoroughly by our city officials and the Defense Council, who are concerned with the planning of space for housing war workers.

War restrictions on the manufacture and sale of certain kinds of civilian goods has cut down on the need for retail space for these goods. The store spaces they are giving up ordinarily is already equipped with all the necessary facilities that would be required for housing, including plumbing, electricity, sewerage, and the like. From the viewpoint of war workers the location of these stores is good for housing purposes, since they need maximum transportation facilities.

Under the Latham Act, public money could be used for the leasing and conversion of such structures. WPA and the National Housing Agency are actively interested in the possibilities. The Railway Real Estate Board should give it active study. A program of this kind might obviate the need for new buildings which after the war would prove to be superfluous.

The Navy has recently worked out an experimental project of the kind. A vacant tobacco factory was leased and converted into a number of small living units.

Other experts consider that this is the optimistic view. They argue that both Germany and Japan have immense armies and resources, and that it will take another year or two to wear them down and bring them to their knees. In any event, no informed commentator subscribes to the current rumors that the war is likely to be ended before 1942 passes. And none of them make the popular mistake of thinking that minor United Nations victories constitute major disasters for the enemy.

In the meantime, this country has reason to be immensely proud of the quality and character of its fighting forces. After the debacle at Pearl Harbor, it took us months to get organized. For a long time there was lack of accurate coordination between the various branches of the military services. Now, apparently, conditions have undergone a great change for the better. The gigantic Japanese-American sea engagement around Midway Island is an example. The Japs, after making their feint at Dutch Harbor with a few bombers and pursuit planes, apparently expected that American commanders would hysterically disperse their forces. In all probability, they definitely expected to take both Midway and Oahu. But the American commanders, working on extremely accurate information provided by the Intelligence services, were ready. The Navy, the Army and the Marines worked in perfect harmony. The result was the most serious setback Japan has yet taken in the Pacific war. That battle, coming on top of the Coral Sea engagement, must be causing plenty of headaches among the moguls in Tokyo. They cannot get their forces asleep at Pearl Harbor. But our forces are 100 per cent awake and on their toes now.

This latest Pacific battle is important for the beating handed Japan's military power. Its greatest importance lies in the fact that it has tipped the scales of Pacific naval power in our favor. After Pearl Harbor, the Japanese fleet was supreme in the Pacific. Japan also had air supremacy. Now American war vessels which were damaged at Pearl Harbor are back in service, new ships have been sent to join the fleet, and our air power has been tremendously increased. Our production capacity is many times that of Japan in this field. The Mikado, in brief, doesn't look so big and tough as he once did.

When we finally take the offensive in the Pacific, we may expect hard going for a considerable time. It is obvious that Japan has developed the mandated islands, as well as her own islands, to a very high degree so far as military power is concerned. She may have literally hundreds of air, naval and submarine bases and her plan has been to create a ring of steel about her own part of the Pacific. It will be a real job to destroy these positions—and we can't do it overnight. We must expect losses as we destroy them. But, if we take the way straight to Berlin and Tokyo, and give the Axis powers a full taste of the kind of treatment dealt out to the countries they have subjugated.
